AN INCOMPLETE VICTORY  
South made a lucky bid in today's hand, but his play of the cards was not very effective.

North deals.  
East-West vulnerable.

**Contract Bridge**  
South's shutoff bid prevented East-West from bidding an easy game in clubs. As a matter of fact, they would have made twelve tricks at clubs against the normal spade lead. Even if South had chosen to sacrifice in spades, he would surely be set at five or six spades, whereas he had the chance to make his doubled four-spade contract.  
West opened the king of diamonds and then shifted to the deuce of clubs. South ruffed the ace of clubs and ruffed a diamond in dummy, noting with some apprehension the fall of the jack. He returned to his hand with a club ruff and led a heart.  
West permitted dummy to win the heart trick, whereupon South re-entered his hand with a club ruff to lead his remaining heart. West took his ace and led another diamond. This play held South to nine tricks. If he put up the jack of trumps, East would discard his last heart to prevent dummy from cashing the top heart. And if dummy returned a trump, East would over-ruff and return a trump.  
On ruffing the club ace at the second trick, South should have led a heart at once, knowing from the bidding that the heart ace was probably in the West hand. West would duck, allowing dummy to win with the queen. South could then ruff a club and lead his other heart.  
Now nothing could stop declare from making a second high heart in dummy, together with two diamond ruffs and the six trumps in the South hand.
