ASTOR, CALMLY FACING DEATH, PLAYED THE PART OF A HERO.

When finally the Titanic sank survivors of the wreck agree that John Jacob Astor was washed, along with William T. Stead, from the last lifeboat, launched too late, and followed the great liner to the bed of the sea. Previously he worked hard loading the frightened women of the steerage into the small craft and helped lower them. Despite her pleadings he insisted upon his wife getting into a lifeboat and, with another man, he lifted her in. "May I come with her for her own protection?" he asked the officer in charge. He was told that he must wait. Then he smiled, laid his hand on his wife's shoulder and kissed her. "Good-by, dear," he said, cheerily. "Don't worry. I'll see you soon." He lit a cigarette and stood smiling and bowing to Mrs. Astor as the boat was lowered. As the last lifeboats drew off, while the hand knelt, playing "Nearer, My God, to Thee," the rescue saw Col. Astor standing by the rail with Major Butt. Both were smiling, saluting and bowing. B. B. Steffanson of the Swedish Legation in Washington tells how he came with Col. Astor from loading the women of the steerage into the lifeboats. They met Mrs. Astor on the deck, and when both told her she must get into a lifeboat she began screaming. "Mrs. Astor said she could not leave him," Mr. Steffanson told a reporter for The World, "but Col. Astor insisted. We took Mrs. Astor and lifted her into a lifeboat. He kissed her very gently, and told her not to worry. I did not hear him ask permission to get into the boat. He was very cool and kept bowing and smiling at his wife, who looked up at him beseechingly. To him and Major Butt, death was nothing. "After Col. Astor saw his wife disappear in the gloom he tossed away his cigarette and went on with the work of getting off the women and children. It was hard work. Many of them we had to toss into the boats like bags of meal." Mrs. John Pilshury Snyder, bride of only a few weeks, told at the Waldorf yesterday of seeing Col. Astor just after the collision. "When I came up on deck," said Mrs. Snyder, "I heard Col. Astor ask Capt. Smith if he had not better awaken Mrs. Astor. He said he did not wish unnecessarily to disturb her as she was in delicate health. I did not hear the captain's answer, but I saw Col. Astor turn pale and hurry below. When he returned a little later he was supporting his wife and patting her reassuringly on the back. It made me feel better just to see him." At Mrs. Astor's home, No. 840 Fifth Avenue, this statement was made last evening. "Mrs. Astor says that Col. Astor pushed off with a number of others at the last moment on one of the collapsible boats. It sank at once, as they evidently forgot to put the plug in." George A.
