BIG FLOODS IN CENTRAL AND EASTERN

States Cause Vast Damage, Flooding Mines, Wrecking Bridges And Railways --- Bridge Collapsed Killing Seven

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 11. (Special)—Loss of life and great damage to property are reported from the central and eastern States by floods caused by the heavy rains of the last few days.

The Delaware, Susquehanna and Schuylkill rivers are rising rapidly and the small streams throughout the coal regions have overflowed their banks, flooding the mines, causing cave-ins and doing great damage to railroad and other property.

CHINESE WILL DO THEIR OWN POLICE WORK Chinese Imperial Customs department To Police The West River

PEKIN, Dec. 10.—The Imperial customs department, of which Sir Robert Hart is director-general, settling aside previous objections, is now prepared to proceed with the policing of the West River, according to the plans of Great Britain.

AMBASSADOR BRYCE UNDER ORDERS TO GO British Ambassador To Washington To Visit London, And May Not Return

LONDON, Dec. 10.—It is expected that Mr. Bryce, the British ambassador at Washington, will visit London early in the year, for the purpose of consulting with the authorities of the Foreign Office, principally with reference to the relations between America and Japan.

It is by no means certain that he will return, and, in case he does not, his successor will probably be Sir Henry Howard, the British minister at The Hague.
