Bishops May Open Southcott Box

(By Dominion News Service) PLYMOUTH, Oct. 24.—Followers of Joanna Southcott, the prophetess who died 130 years ago, and left a sealed box to be opened by twenty bishops, are demanding that the box shall be opened during the conference of the Church Congress at Plymouth now being held. The Bishop of Truro, one of the presidents of the Congress said: "We are perfectly willing to open the box, but we will not submit to the ridiculous conditions. One of these conditions is that when we have opened the box we shall all remain together for six weeks to discuss the contents. That is asking too much. "Where is the box?" he was asked. The Bishop replied: "I do not know. Joanna Southcott's followers know that it cannot be opened here, because there are not twenty bishops at the congress." Mrs. Janet Fox, of Falmouth, is leading the demonstrations which have been organized to bring pressure on the Bishops. Miss Alice Jones, one of her lieutenants, said: "The time is coming when the Bishops who have scorned Joanna Southcott will go on their bonded knees. Already they are shaking in their shoes." The Bishops, however, mingled with the 2,000 guests at a reception given by the mayor looked quite unperturbed.

P. W. C. DEBATING SOCIETY

The society held the regular debate in the College on Tuesday morning, Oct. 23rd. The subject, "Resolved that the League of Nations is worthy of the full support of all governments of the world" was fairly well discussed. Mr. Anthony Francis, as leader of the "Pro" side opened the debate and in an eloquent and persuasive speech he made a strong appeal in favor of the League. Mr. Harry Foster as leader of the "Con" side denounced the League stating that it would be impossible to have an account of creed, color and desire for world power among the nations. Two of the debaters found it convenient to be absent from the meeting, strong measures must be put into force if this sort of discrimination continues. The vote resulted in a victory for the "Pro" side. The critic offered some suggestions for the improvement of future debates. His statements were corroborated by the Honorary President who urged the members to avoid the use of large words and unfamiliar constructions and to make their speech as forceful as possible. We hope to see these suggestions adopted in subsequent debates.
