TERMS OF PEACE.

The news seems to be confirmed that the Transvaal and Orange State Governments have made certain overtures for peace. They stipulate as a first condition that the independence of the two Dutch Republics shall be guaranteed! No doubt they make this proposal because the fortunes of the war have turned against them and nothing better than defeat and loss can come of continuing the struggle. Equally they feel that when their country and their capitals are once occupied by the British armies the Transvaal and Orange State Republics will have ceased to exist for the future. The proposals now put forward are made as the only alternative to save them from unconditional surrender later on.

But not upon such easy terms can peace be now made. Wantonly the forces of the Republics invaded Natal, Cape Colony, Zululand, Bechuanaland and Rhodesia, besieging peaceful cities, ravaging the properties of Britain's loyal subjects, putting them in terror and destroying their lives. They audaciously deposed the British authority, proclaimed the annexation of northern Natal, northern Cape Colony and a large section of Bechuanaland and set up their own authority therein. Now that they have been driven out, the besieged cities relieved, Cronje and his army made prisoners, and the remainder of the Boer forces are demoralised and flying, Kruger wants peace and independence!

It is written, "They that take the sword shall perish by the sword." Kruger and Steyn will soon learn how true it is, they set the example of annexing territories. Justice demands that they shall lose the countries they have misruled. There must be equal rights throughout South Africa. As in British countries there must be "one law for yourselves and for the stranger within the gates." Nothing short of the restoration of British sovereignty throughout all that region can secure equality and justice. There must be no Majuba settlement this time. The war has cost too much in British blood and treasure to be so tamely ended.

The existence of slavery in the Island of Guam under United States rule has been the subject of much adverse comment. It has now been terminated by a proclamation of Governor Leary, who asserts the entire abolition of slavery and peonage. What is spoken of as peonage was a system by which the creditor could hold the debtor in personal serfitude till the debt was paid. As half the population were in debt to the other half it would appear that half the population were in serfitude. Washington's birthday, February 22, was fixed as the date when the emancipation proclamation should go into operation.

which we call the Anglo-Saxon race and of this race are we. Not by our election or selection. If there is advantage, opportunity, glory, freedom in our belonging to this mighty race, the gratitude of our hearts must be given, not to man, but to Him who determined "the bounds of our habitation" and opened to us this opportunity of service, by making us not Russians, nor Africans, but Anglo Saxons.

We are not only members of this prolific and dominating race, but we are citizens of the world's greatest empire. We were at one time the fewest of all people, but the Lord hath set His love upon us and hath chosen us, and the nation once a speck on the world's chart, has become the leader in the world's councils. For more than a thousand years the British Empire has been able to inspire the deepest passion of devotion in her sons and daughters--and to maintain her honor they count not their life dear unto them. "A land of settled government--a land of old and just renown--where freedom slowly broadens down from precedent to precedent." A nation whose drum beat to arms echoes the world around, and on whose broad possessions the sun always shines. God's advance herald of Liberty, Equality and Fraternity--the land of the brave and the home of the free. The preacher would give place to no man in his attachment to the throne, admiration of our past history, present advantages and future possibilities.

We are also Canadians. A recent traveller had gone round the world to visit the different parts of the British Empire. He recorded his observation, in what he called "The Greater Britain." Canada is part of the greater Britain, and Canadians are called of God to lay, in this rich, broad, well-watered land, and under favoring skies the foundation, wisely and well, of this part of the great empire. With nearly one-half of the continent--a larger territory than the United States possesses demanding the attention of the immigrant, vast agricultural and mineral wealth, the sons of all lands erecting their tents by the brackish waters of vast prairies, felling forests through which the buffalo and moose have roamed untamed from the cradle of time; the fourth maritime power of the world, the second of American commonwealths, able to put under arms, if need be, half a million of stalwart sons to defend their noble heritage, we can be excused for glorying in "our ain countrie." The riches of the mines are in our mountains. The riches of food are in our prairies, and of timber in our forests. The best water system of America is in Canada, and the key to it has been placed in the hands of the Canadian people. We have also free institutions, and the largest opportunities for self development. The best of constitutions, not based on any abstract principle of political excellence, but one that has grown as the British nation grew, has been fully tested in the envy of nations, the glory of our people, and the care of God. This is but the early morning of our associated life; our history is now being made. And the land, that has produced the men, whose names are

recorded in Britain's story as brave defenders of her throne and laws in olden times and whose sons today under African sun and stars face with the courage of most experienced heroes the music of the guns, can be very hopeful of the coming time and the coming men. It is greatly to our benefit that we are Anglo-Saxons, Britons and Canadians. But we had nothing to do with it. We did not choose the race or the nation; we did not put the gold into the mountain; the vegetable wealth into the acres; the health into the air; nor the freedom into the national life. We did not select our birth place, nor decide upon our cradle. Moses never does that, nor does he pick out the King's daughter that shall find him. This was all done for us, and a sense of the honor and the responsibility comes to us, who live in this day of the country's history. It is ours to lay the foundation of institutions that will continue and effect national character through all the future years. Let us cultivate the affection, the purity, the order, the mingled love of law, the household piety for which the builders of our Empire were known. Industry, honesty, truthfulness, temperance, obedience are the foundation stones of national perpetuity. There is nothing by which a country perishes so surely and quickly as by moral decay. Vain the mightiest ships of iron framed. Vain our all conquering guns, unless old Britain keeps untamed, the true heart of her sons. Only righteousness exalted a nation.

With a great inheritance, we face a future big with events. The Empire has entered on a new age, which is both high and difficult. Ideals as unique, as they are magnificent are taking hold of the people. One Queen, one flag, one country, one Parliament. The dream of imperial federation already is fulfilled. A thousand sons of Canada under arms in far off Africa, a thousand more to man the garrisons at Halifax, and brave men by their own election, saying a hasty farewell, and hurrying to the field of strife to take the places of comrades who fell as brave men and heroes fall--for the Queen, and flag and home. Yours my brothers, is the ancestral faith; yours the rich heritage of race and nation; yours the memories and example of our brave boys, who fell, with their face to the foe. Be worthy of your heritage; quit ye like men; be strong. You have a loftier character to sustain, a grander mission to fulfill, now that your Taylor and Riggs have fallen. Boys, our hopes go with you. Our prayers, our hearts, our tears, our faith, triumphant o'er our fears, are all with thee, are all with thee.

Ye will be worthy sons of worthy sires, and Europe already knows she must reckon with you--when the old land goes down to the war. This is our faith and victory--
