THE NORTHWEST ADVANCING.

One or more new Provinces are to be established in the Northwest by legislation during the current session. So the Dominion grows. At first four Provinces were united in the federation of 1867. The next was a new creation, the Province of Manitoba set up in 1870. British Columbia was brought in a year later and the Island joined the union in 1873. Thus in six years the four original Provinces of the Dominion were increased to seven. For over thirty years there have been no additions to the provincial sisterhood. Now we take a new stride forward. The time seems ripe for the advance. The rapid development of the Northwest, its extensive crops and live stock production, its vast railway system and the rapid influx of settlers have made an imperative call for provincial autonomy. The Territories, including the Yukon, now have a representation of eleven members in the Commons, being in that respect equal to British Columbia and P. E. Island combined. The creation of one or more new Provinces just now will afford a fine advertisement for the growing Canadian Dominion.

THE PORTLAND TERMINUS.

If the esteemed Patriot is desirous of discussing the Atlantic terminus of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway it can be accommodated. Possibly no great good can come of the discussion, now that the Dominion is irrevocably committed to the Government scheme. But the fact remains that the only Atlantic port now or hereafter to be directly reached by Grand Trunk rails is the foreign port of Portland, Maine. That city is greatly rejoiced over the prospect of being the principal shipping port for the Canadian Northwest and all its newspapers have had a succession of jubilant editorials on the subject. St. John, on the contrary, has been much depressed, and has gone resolutely into opposition to the Laurier Government on account of losing the advantage conferred on Portland. We fail to see what possible gain can accrue to the Liberal party, for which the Patriot speaks, by renewing the discussion of these matters, but that is none of our funeral. One rather staid blunder has led our contemporary on to a second and worse one. Better let sleeping dogs lie, brother.

The outer circle of the fortifications of Port Arthur made a circuit of over forty miles. If Charlottetown were defended in like manner the outer fortifications would circle about the city and port from Vernon River Bridge on the east up to the North Shore and round to DeSable on the west. If within that area there were thirty to forty hills each from four hundred to a thousand feet in height and every one of these crowned with fortifications and batteries of powerful guns some idea of the extent if not of the strength of the fortress would be had.

Radcliffe the Dominion executioner being otherwise engaged, the Sheriff of Carleton County, N. B. was unwillingly compelled to inflict the extreme penalty of the law upon a murderer yesterday. Though few would willingly discharge this painful duty, there is nothing degrading in the connection. Grover Cleveland when he was Sheriff of Erie County in earlier life performed the duty of hanging a man, and although afterward, when he was a candidate for the Presidency the cry of "hangman" was raised, it did not prevent his being twice elected to the highest and most honorable position in the gift of his countrymen. Duty may sometimes be unpleasant but can never be dishonorable.
