Livestock

MONTREAL, Nov. 6-(CP)—All classes of livestock were steady to a shade higher on Montreal market today the Dominion Department of Agriculture reported. Receipts: Cattle 956; calves 1,937; sheep 3,038; hogs 2,764. There was less than a thousand cattle. Sales were slow and prices a shade firmer on the few cattle sold but there were not enough sales to establish firm prices. Cows were firmer. Veal calves were from \$6 to \$10 with the bulk between \$8 and \$9. Drinkers ranged from \$5 to \$7. Grassers made the bulk of the offerings and brought mostly \$4.50 with a range of \$4.25 to \$4.75. Heavy calves were hard to sell. Lambs were 25 cents higher. Fresh sales were made at \$9.75 for good ewes and wethers. Heavy lambs were cut \$1 per cwt. Culls and bucks were cut \$2 per cwt. Sheep were from \$3 to \$5. Hogs were steady at \$9 for bacon-fed and watered, and \$9.25 for trucks. Selects drew \$1 per hog premium, with the regular cuts on off grades. Sows drew from \$6 to \$7 tops \$7.25. Hogs sold on rail grade brought \$12 net weight.
