MILTON'S TRICENTENARY.

John Milton was born in 1608. He wrote in his time a hundred books, treatises, poems pamphlets, all of which disclose the hand of a master.

These men were each conscious of their own greatness, as genius must needs be. Milton in Paradise Lost proclaimed that he would "soar with no middle flight" and "would attempt things unattempted yet in prose or rhyme."

"What needs my Shakespeare, for his honored bones The labor of an age in piled stones." Dryden, (born 1631; died 1701) was for some forty odd years a contemporary of Milton, and he in six memorable lines assigned to the author of Paradise Lost his place in the great literature of the ages:

Three poets in three distant ages born, Greece, Italy and England did adorn.

The first in loftiness of thought surpassed; The next in majesty; in both the last.

The force of nature could no further go.

To make a third she joined the former two. The verdict stands good after three hundred years, and this is fame. The yester reading public of today, heir of all the ages, accepts as an indubitable fact that in three centuries past there has not risen in the literary world a greater than John Milton.

It is given out from Ottawa that Parliament will meet on 20th January. This is late enough in all conscience. Some years ago the ending of the fiscal year was changed from 30th June to 31st March, to enable Parliament to meet earlier.

WE WANT THE TUNNEL.

We want the Tunnel. It is seventeen years since Sir Wilfrid Laurier as good as promised it to us in his famous letter to The Guardian. Since then Canada has undertaken the Transcontinental at a cost of two hundred millions, the Hudson Bay Railway to cost thirty to fifty millions and has made surveys and estimates for the Georgian Bay Canal, to cost one hundred and twenty millions, and the Minister of Railways promised that in the near future a new Welland Canal would be undertaken to cost thirty millions.

Is this fair, honest, just—is it decent treatment? All this time the faith of Canada has stood pledged to give us continuous communication by steam with the mainland summer and winter. Shall it pass into history that Canada is regardless of her most solemn obligations?

It is too funny for anything to see The Patriot "making faces" at The Guardian's splendid record of achievement.

Thursday next will be polling day in the election to decide whether the Canada Temperance Act shall remain in force in Westmorland, N. B. The Act was brought into force in 1880, and repeated, but hitherto unsuccessful efforts have been made to revoke it. The county is a large and populous one. The names of 3,146 electors are signed to the petition against the Act, but probably not all of these will vote against it.

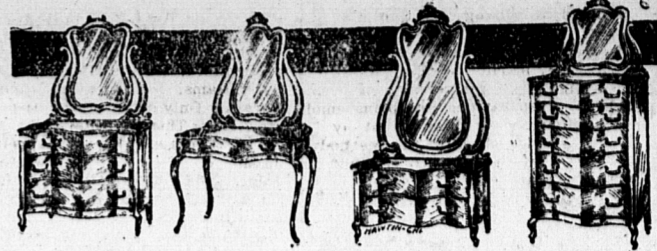

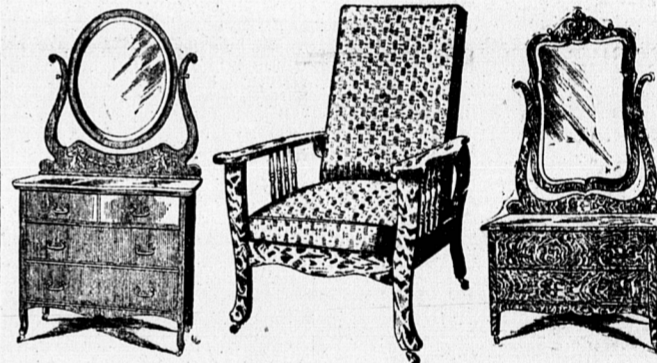

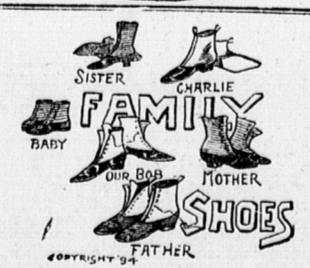
