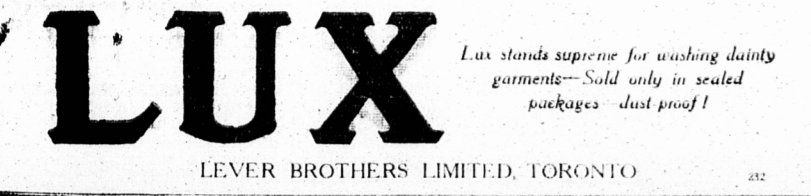

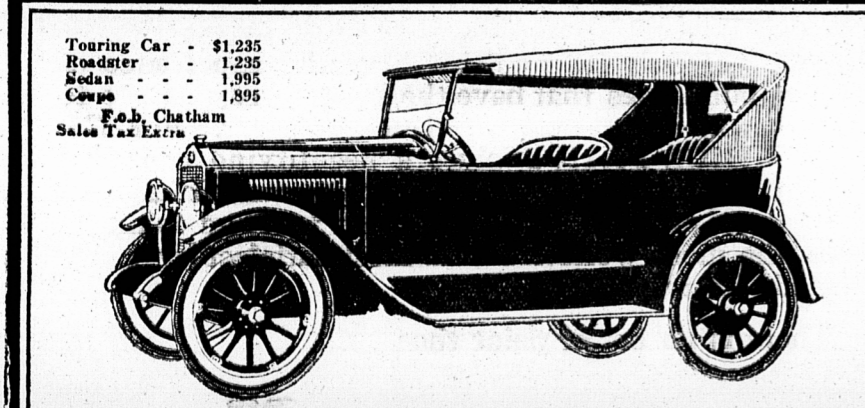

THE VATICAN DENIES TREATY WITH RUSSIA. ROME, April 27.—The Vatican denies the existence of any treaty between it and Soviet Russia. It was learned at the Vatican today that there has been no re-establishment of diplomatic relations with Russia. The Holy See is preparing to send an expedition of Jesuits and others to Russia in work purely in connection with the succoring of the famine-stricken regions. The expedition, it is stated, will have no missionary or other religious aims.
