Stock Markets At A Glance

WINNIPEG, July 31 (CP)—The Dominion Kingdom interest purchased 350,000 bushels of high grade wheat today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange and traders reported a small trade in barley to eastern Canada. CHICAGO, July 31 (AP)—The Grain Market was dull today and price changes in the wheat pit were minor. All futures showed an easy undertone with oats and rye leading the decline. MONTREAL, July 31 (CP)—Securities were mildly irregular in light trading today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market. In the indices, industrials and golds made some headway but utilities and papers were revised downward. NEW YORK, July 31 (AP)—The Stock Market today emerged from a losing month with selective recoveries appearing in most departments although many leaders still languished in minus territory. The Associated Press stock average was unchanged at 54.7 and for July was off 8 of a point.

ALBERTA REGULATIONS

EDMONTON, July 31 (AP)—Alberta provincial election voters in single-member constituencies will be able, for the first time, to mark the candidate of their choice with either an "X" or an "I" in voting Aug. 8. Provincial election officials said today that in the past under the single transferable vote system there has been numerous spoiled ballots caused by voters marking their first choice with an "X" instead of the "I" required under the regulations. However, under the amended regulations, other choices must be marked with figures. Thus the voter places "2" before the name

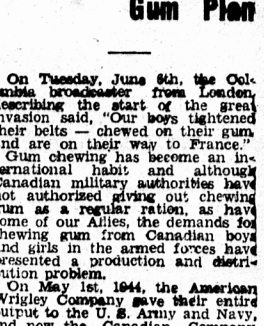

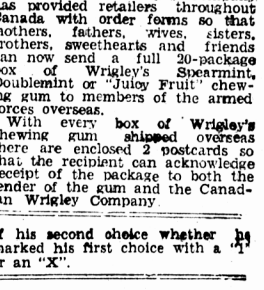

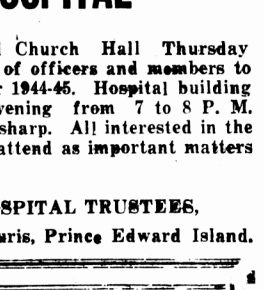
