PRAYERS FOR THE DEAD.

The letter of "Queen's County" in today's issue will be read with interest no doubt by those who concern themselves with the question of prayers for the dead. The writer admits that his letter is called forth by that of "Plain Worshipper" in a previous issue of this journal, but it is scarcely any sense of the word a reply thereto. In fact with one exception he has listened and with some ingenuity avoided every point raised by "Plain Worshipper." The exception is that "Queen's County" admits that the High Church school is Catholic, (not Protestant or Roman Catholic) and claims that it does not conceal its aims in any way.

We print also the letter of Rev. James Simpson, Priest Incumbent of St. Peter's Cathedral, in which he properly defends himself against some charges made, we must think inadvertently or from misinformation by "Plain Worshipper." We believe that Rev. Mr. Simpson has never concealed his opinions, and that from the beginning of his incumbency, he has as his predecessor did, taught his people to pray for the souls of the departed.

to relieve him from the charge of an undue desire to make proselytes, but equally with "Queens County" it leaves "Plain Worshipper's" main contention unanswered. Many thousands of devout readers of the Bible have failed to find within its pages an support for the doctrine and practice of prayers for the dead. If they could help those who have passed out of this life they would gladly do so, but they hesitate to undertake an office to which they cannot see that they are called by any teaching or example of Our Savior or His Apostles, or of the lawgivers, prophets, psalmists or preachers of the older dispensation.

The Bible teaches much about prayer and gives many examples of prayers of devout persons in different ages, who had the same loving regard for and interest in departed friends as we have. Nothing is clearer than they prayed for the living. Surely, the same cannot be said on the authority of the Bible in regard to prayers for the dead. To our Roman Catholic brethren it is sufficient that the doctrine is authoritatively taught by their Church, by tradition and by the fathers. We have no controversy with them in regard to this or to other doctrines fervently believed by them but which we cannot accept.
