WHERE THEY STRIKE OIL.

Something About the Rich Lands in California.

While oil as the basis of an industry, oil as an investment, oil as a speculation, has probably been much overboomed, in the last few years, there is no doubting the wealth of the deposits or springs, rather, in the rich bituminous shale sections of the Gold State, nor the bona fides of many of the large companies that have been incorporated by prominent men in that State and the State of Washington. Jenkins, Secretary and H. W. Findley Man's Director.

It is improbable that such gentlemen as the above would hazard their high official and business reputations by lending their names to anything but an incorporation in which they had every faith, and the high repute of the undertaking is further vouched for in a report on the property by Colonel Crane, possibly the greatest oil-expert of the State, who after a very careful examination of this Company's oil lands in Colusa, Lake and Glenn Counties, California, comprising 2,230 acres in all, reports in part as follows:

The average life of an oil-well is 25 years, many of those in Pennsylvania having been active for 40 years. Gushers are not common in California, but experts say that these are not always desirable, as they expire much sooner than the well.—Vancouver News Advertiser, September 17th.
