Bruins Sell McReavy To Detroit In Exchange For Dutch Hiller And \$5,000

DETROIT, Nov. 24.—(AP)—Detroit Red Wings of the National Hockey League announced today acquisition of winger Pat McReavy from Boston Bruins in exchange for the veteran Wilbert (Dutch) Hiller and \$5,000.

The Red Wings also said they had called up Kenny Kilrea, top American League scouter, from their Indianapolis farm in exchange for Connie Brown. Kilrea will join the club in Boston.

Hiller was sold to Detroit by New York Rangers after last season's playoffs.

The order-in-council covering rentals of all real property, to be administered by the board, provides:

1. In areas previously subject to rent control, the maximum rentals already fixed for housing accommodation continue unchanged.

2. In all other parts of Canada, the maximum rental for any housing accommodation is the rental under the latest lease since Jan. 1, 1940.

3. For any business premises, land and premises used for combined business and dwelling purposes anywhere in Canada, the maximum rental is that which was in effect Oct. 11, 1941; or, if none was then in force, the rental under the latest lease since Jan. 1, 1940.

4. Premises rented for the first time after Oct. 11, 1941, may have their maximum rentals determined by or under future orders of the board.

The "maximum rentals regulations" apply to the rental of any improved or unimproved land, any furnished or unfurnished store, shop, office building, factory, warehouse, suite, office, house, apartment, flat, room, or other place of dwelling, or any structure or part of a structure used for combined business and dwelling purposes.

Maximum charges for room and board are also fixed under the ceiling order. The supplying of meals is listed as one of the services whose price may not be increased under the maximum prices regulation and increases in room rentals now are also prohibited.

All leases for land or premises not previously affected by rental regulations are automatically amended to bring them into conformity with these regulations.

After Dec. 1 the maximum rental to demand or offer to pay a tenant in excess of the maximum, violation of which is a criminal offence, is liable to a penalty of up to \$5,000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years, or both. Any amount of rental paid in excess of the fixed maximum is recoverable by the tenant.

Every landlord or agent is henceforth required to keep available for inspection a record describing clearly and fully property affected by the regulations, the amount of the fixed rental, the name of the tenant, and the names of preceding tenants.

Spencer Scott Opening day Goes to Hanover Games announced Shoe Farms

HANOVER, Pa., Nov. 24.—(AP)—Spencer Scott, world's champion trotting stallion owned by Charles W. Phillis of Greenwich, Conn., has been leased to the Hanover Shoe Farms for a term of years, the terms of which were not disclosed.

Spencer Scott, now aged four years, set the trotting stallion record of 1:57 1-4 at Lexington, Ky., last Sept. 24, bettering the former mark of 1:58 1-4 set in 1916 by Lee Awworthy.

Spencer Scott was the winner of the 1940 Hambleton and Kentucky Futurity, together with a number of other stake events. He has been in pasture in Lexington since the end of last racing season.

Acquisition through leasing of the services of Spencer Scott gives the Hanover Shoe Farms the use of the world's champion stallions of the two galls of harness racing.

Intl. League Comes to aid Of Toronto

SYRACUSE, N.Y., Nov. 24.—(AP)—The International Baseball League came to the aid of the ailing Toronto Maple Leafs today with a revenue-boosting plan after the last-place club's new president, Peter G. Campbell, told league moguls he represented a syndicate of Toronto sportsmen determined to continue operation in the circuit.

Campbell, who recently took over as head of the club when it appeared uncertain whether the Maple Leafs would field a team in 1942, informed the league's directors at their annual meeting a new group of backers had been organized to support the team.

The league, which elected Campbell a new director, decided to allot Toronto 50 per cent of the net receipts of seven Sunday games played away from the Canadian city which has no Sunday baseball.

Under the plan, each of the seven clubs will designate one of its home Sunday games against Toronto as a "home" game for the visiting Leafs and share half the receipts. A similar plan was in operation last summer.
