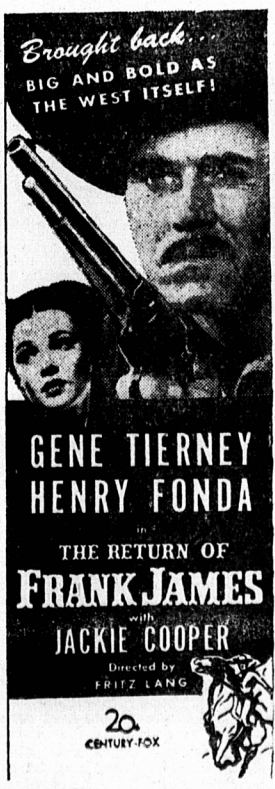
Friends will be pleased to know that Mr. Campbell (Station agent) has completely recovered from his indisposition in the Western Hospital, and has now resumed his duties. —A.
