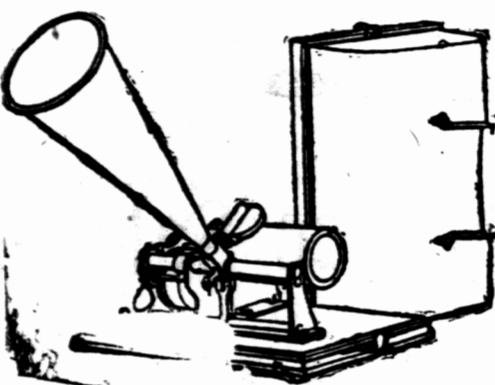

THE resignation of Rev. D. S. Fraser, pastor of the Springside congregation, is placed in the hands of the Truro Presbytery. A post office awaits him to join the staff of the Presbyterian Witness office at Halifax as managing editor. Mr. Fraser is well-known in Charlottetown where he spoke at the Summer School for Sunday school teachers.

THE Black Diamond beat Coban arrived yesterday at Ingraham's wharf from Montreal and Charlottetown with general cargo. She has also several cattle and about 200 sheep besides general cargo for St. John's. This is the last trip of the Coban for the season, navigation on the St. Lawrence closing this week. The Bonavista which sails for Charlottetown, Sydney and St. John's to-day, will be the last cargo boat from Montreal this year—Sydney Post.

THE Richibucto N. B. Review says: The topsail schooner Bolina, while going out of the harbor loaded with lumber the day after the heavy storm last week, grounded. It is claimed that the channel filled with sand during the storm; hence the accident. The vessel soon filled with water and being deserted by the crew, she still lies on the bar, keeled over. She is an old schooner and is owned by H. E. Acors, Souris. An attempt was made to take her off on Monday after her deckload was taken off, but it was unsuccessful.

At the Police Court yesterday the adjourned case against Elmira Downing, widow of the late Walter Downing was dismissed. The defendant swore that the case was conducted by Seymour Gregory. The magistrate in giving judgment said that although he viewed the evidence for the defence with suspicion still he would give the defendant the benefit of the doubt and accordingly dismissed the case. A. J. B. Mellish appeared for Mrs. Downing. Two drunks Allan McDonald and James McIntyre were each fined \$10 or 30 days.
