"A PLEDGE REPUDIATED AND A MAN DISHONORED."

Under this caption the Brooklyn Eagle comments severely upon Theodore Roosevelt's announced consent to again enter himself as a candidate for the Presidency.

The White House, Nov. 8, 1904. On the fourth of March next I shall have served three and a half years. These three and a half years constitute my first term.

This statement was absolute; it was volunteered and it was confirmed later, on December 11, 1907, Mr. Roosevelt, referring to it and speaking for publication, said:

"I have not changed and shall not change the decision thus announced." But these absolute, peremptory and seemingly binding pledges have now been renounced and repudiated by Mr. Roosevelt.

We have had instances in Canada from time to time in which candidates for Parliament have solemnly pledged themselves if elected not to seek or accept another nomination for the same position, yet who have afterwards done so.

A further defence is found in these cases in the argument that a public man, a servant of the people and en-

dowed with the capacity to render them efficient and useful service, has no right to make a promise such as Mr. Roosevelt made in 1904 and repeated in 1907, and that having wrongfully made such a promise it may be better broken than kept.

Another matter involved is the question of a third term for a man who has already served two terms in the White House. We must bear in mind that there is nothing in the constitution or the laws of the United States which forbids an ex-President being a candidate for a third term, or which forbids the people electing him.

President Grant having served two full terms, and being the idol of the nation on account of his great military services was willing in his day to receive the nomination for a third term. He was bound by no pledges such as Mr. Roosevelt has given, yet his party refused to renominate him.

A JUDGE (?) OF INDEPENDENCE.
