THE annual meeting of the Stock Breeders Association for the Maritime provinces was held in the Winter Fair building a few evenings ago. There was a large presentation present from Nova Scotia and New Brunswick but none from Prince Edward Island. E. B. Elderkin was again elected president and all the other officers as well as the other members of the executive were reappointed.

NEIL STEWART, city, who went to Demerara on board the schooner Corona, loaded here by Charles Lyons and John McQuillan, in charge of the live stock has returned, having driven to the city from Cape Traverse on Wednesday night. The trip to the West Indies occupied thirty days and considerable rough weather was met with, it taking twenty one days alone to cross the Gulf Stream. During the trip two cattle and a quantity of poultry of the deck cargo were lost.

ON the 9th. of January there passed away one of the most prominent of the old St. John's pioneers, Donald Nicholson, Lot 30, in the 89th. year of his age. Born in Fladda of Ransay, in Scotland, within a year after the battle of Waterloo, in the reign of George III, he married about the time of Queen Victoria's coronation, and emigrated to this province in 1840. Settling in Lot 30 which was but a forest then, he cleared the farm on which he lived during these 65 years. He had 11 children of whom 8 died, and the survivors, with their children and grandchildren, make a living total of 94 descendants. When these pioneers came to the Island they would have been desirous of religious services but for a number of gifted men among themselves, who conducted meetings. These meetings resulted in a local revival through which a considerable number acknowledged a saving change. Donald Nicholson was one of the latter, and he was probably the last survivor of the company. He was ordained an Elder in 1873, and since then, took his full share in the work of session and congregation being gifted in prayer and "integrity in the Scriptures." He could lecture intelligently, and "speak to the question" with union, his private life being always such as to win increasing respect in the community. He fought a good fight. He finished his course. He kept the faith. His death occurred suddenly while he was visiting his daughters in Hopedale. The funeral from R. McLeod's, near Hunter River, was largely attended, although roads and weather were roughly unpleasant. A brief service was conducted by the pastor, who, on the following Sabbath, preached a memorial sermon from which the above sketch is condensed. The text taken was: "Thou hast given me the heritage of those that fear Thy name."
