EDUCATIONAL MEETING.—Quite a number of ratepayers and others interested in education met at the Melville school on Tuesday night, Feb. 3rd. A discussion as to the best means of raising the status of education in this district was opened by Inspector Crockett. The secretary, trustees and quite a number of the ratepayers took part in the deliberations and considerable interest was aroused. Several improvements are about to be made and any teacher desirous of securing a good school in a large district would do well to correspond with the secretary.

REMOVALS.—The Dominion Express Company, Charlottetown, have moved into their new offices on the corner of Queen and Richmond Streets, formerly occupied by Brown's Post Card store. Before entering their new quarters the company had the former store remodelled and refitted. It is now one of the most artistic and luxuriously furnished offices in Charlottetown. The office just vacated by the Express Company has been leased by Mr. Samuel Craig, Charlottetown, for his tailoring business. He has had it fitted up as an up-to-date tailor shop and has moved into his new premises.

ENQUIRIES FROM ABROAD.—The Publicity Agent, Mr. J. E. B. McCready, received almost simultaneously two letters of a like nature from Vancouver and Halifax enquiring as to the reasons for the remarkable prosperity reported to exist in Prince Edward Island, and enquiring for general information in regard to the Province and its various industries. A prompt reply with complete information was forwarded in each case. There are more enquiries, says Mr. McCready, than heretofore from parties contemplating returning to, or taking up residence in, Prince Edward Island, and the fact has been brought to light that every house in Charlottetown is occupied persons desirous of coming here to live being unable to obtain suitable dwellings. There may be a point in this for the builders and real estate men in Charlottetown. A gentleman, it might be mentioned, a point in support of the foregoing statement, was anxious to take up residence with his family here, and finding himself unable to secure a suitable place in Charlottetown, he has rented a house outside of the city, a short distance away.

THE W. S. HARKINS COMPANY.—A. K. Munde, and the members of the W. S. Harkins Theatrical Company arrived in St. John Wednesday evening from St. John's (Nfld.). Mr. Munde said that the season had been the most successful Mr. Harkins has ever had. It began at St. John's on Jan. 5, when there was capacity business. Governor and Mr. Davison patronized three performances, and Archibush Howley one, all expressing regret that they were unable to attend more often. After one of the performances the governor expressed the wish to meet Miss Van Duser, and Mr. Stubbs, and they were introduced to him when they, and the company, were congratulated on the performances. Miss Van Duser, and the ladies of the company, were also presented to the archbishop. It had been the intention of the company to sail from Halifax on Jan. 30 by the Coquedoc for Bermuda. When that vessel was wrecked Mr. Harkins had just arrived in Sydney, en route to New York, but after learning that the boat would sail for New York to secure accommodation for the company on the boats leaving there, but was unable to do so until Feb. 9, so the stay in St. John's was extended for another week. They left St. John's last Sunday evening. The company left for New York Thursday morning. Mr. Munde proceeding there next Saturday and all sailing together for Bermuda on Monday at midnight. The trip will include Bermuda, Barbados, Trinidad, Demerara, Jamaica, Panama and Colon.
