Yesterday morning's session, concluded the annual meeting of the P. E. I. Fruit Growers Association and the Co-operative Fruit Company. A. McNeill, Ottawa gave a very apt and forcible demonstration of fruit packing in barrels and boxes and A. E. Dewar, President of the Association, gave a very interesting and instructive talk on spraying, speaking from actual experience.

There was but one change in the city market prices yesterday, i.e. potatoes which sold at forty to forty-five cents a bush. The unfavorable weather which has been prevailing here for some time has made the roads very heavy and has produced a noticeable effect on the market as there is a general falling off of products. In the pork market especially can this be seen as the mild, rainy weather interferes with the keeping of pork. As farmers are inclined to kill off at this season the product piles up on the market and the price has a tendency to decline.

Mrs. John West, of Wetaskewin, Alberta, is at present in Berlin, Germany, with her youngest daughter, who is taking voice culture in one of the leading schools of music in that city, as well as a course in modern languages. Mrs. West is also accompanied by her eldest son, Sackville, and they have visited London, Paris, the cities of Switzerland, the art galleries of Munich, and were fortunate in being present at the Passion Play at Oberammergau. 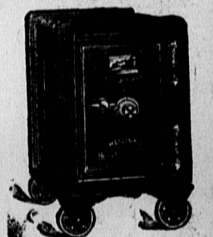
