TORONTO, Dec. 12—Thompson

Cadillac—We learned from officials of Thompson Cadillac yesterday that another round has been drilled and blasted in the drift on the 600 foot level and high grade is still showing in the face. The management now believes this ore is the downward continuation of the rich ore shoot down on the 150 foot level.

Mosher Long Lac—It is reported that the deep hole test on Mosher is getting closer to the horizon, where results may be expected. The objective is the extension of the McLeod Cocksutt ore zone which geologists say went downward and westward. Mosher hopes to cut the ore at 1500 or deeper.

GRAIN

WINNIPEG, Dec. 13 — (CP) — For the fourth time in a week, new six-year high prices for wheat were boarded on the Winnipeg grain exchange Saturday as speculators rushed into a bull market. The day's net gain was 1-8 to 1-7-8 cents.

Given an early stimulus by 500,000-bushel export sales, values broke into new high ground in a price-closing rush to buy that followed a similar late upswing at Chicago. December closed at \$1.15 5-8; May \$1.16 7-8, and July \$1.14 1-4.

The market closed strong, at virtually its best levels of the short session. Helpful to the advance were further Italian purchases of wheat, taking large available supplies away from other potential buyers.

Several seasonal high prices were set in the coarse grains market as the movement in wheat spread to that section. Cash grains held firm.

CHICAGO, Dec. 12—Wheat soared nearly three cents to new high price records late today, outdoing this season's peaks and those for a number of years previous. Reports indicating likelihood of subnormal wheat yields in the United States during the coming season because of widespread moisture shortage led to big outbursts of buying. The reports, if correct, would radically change the country's crop prospect.

At the close wheat was up 1 to 2 7-8 cents, Dec. 128 5-8 to 3-4, May 124 3-4 to 7-8, July 112 1-8 to 1-4, corn 1-4 off to 5-8 up, Dec. 106 1-2 to 3-4, May new 102 3-4 to 7-8; oats 3-8 to 5-8 advanced, and provisions unchanged to 12 cts higher.

Cheese averaged 12 3-4 to 13 for Ontario while Quebec was unquoted.

TORONTO, Dec. 13—(CP)—Toronto mining share market developed a definitely strong tendency and gains were registered in all groups in the closing session of the week.

In the golds aggregate turnover for the session was 1,284,000 shares, heaviest Saturday trade since May 23. Gains were limited mainly to a few cents each but 10 to 18 cents each were added by New Gold, Rose, Red Lake Gold Shore, Macassa and God's Lake.

Eldorado registered a minor setback and Castle posted a gain of 7 cents to 1.38. Base Metals had few changes. Hudson Bay added 1-4 and Sherritt 4 cents. Several penny stocks were in demand at substantial price gains.

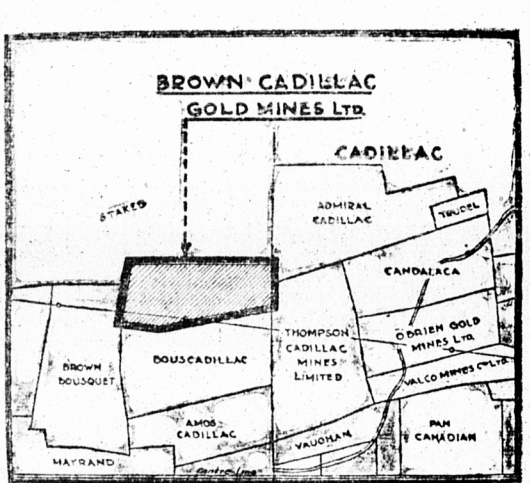
