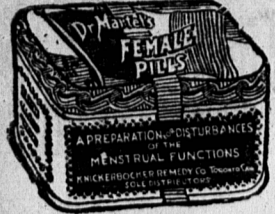

"I will tell him. If he tries to save her let me struggle alone he owes her and I will drown," I thought in my dream.

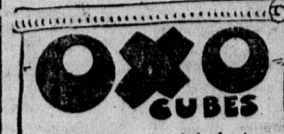

In Memoriam

MR. ALEXANDER COUSINS

Alexander Cousins died at his home in Burlington on March 24th after a short and fatal illness. He sustained wonderful patience in the hours of his affliction and laid his sufferings on the altar of supreme sacrifice.

He was born at Park Corner in 1835. In 1864 he was married to Margaret Profit and they founded a home in Burlington where he resided until his death. These daughters and two sons blessed the union of the happy couple so suited to each other. Surviving his much lamented death are his widow, and daughters, Mrs. Peter Warren, Clinton and Mrs. Herbert Ramsay, Malpeque and sons William, Burlington and Alexander on the homestead. He also leaves ten grandchildren and three great-grandchildren to mourn a loss that human power cannot restore.

The funeral was held on March 25th to the Geddie Memorial Cemetery, French River, and was attended by many neighbors and friends that the deceased, his wife and family have in their own and in neighboring communities. Mrs. Cousins and family are deeply grateful to their kind friends and neighbors for the charitable thoughtfulness shown them during the illness and death of Mr. Cousins.

The deceased was a man of quiet and unassuming manner, and while his friends were legion, his enemies were conspicuously few. He was ever ready and willing to extend a helping hand where assistance was most congenial and his company was ever delectable. His household always extended the glad hand of welcome to all who entered.

HENRY ERNEST READY

Henry Ernest Ready, son of Mr. Michael Ready, Irishtown, died on March 17th after an illness of several months. His disease failed to respond to best medical treatment. He was consoled in his last hours by the comforting, saving influence of the last sacraments of the Catholic Church administered to him by the pastor, Rev. Mr. D. J. Gillis and thus fortified, his soul entered the Presence of the Eternal Judge.

He had just attained his 23rd year and before falling ill seemed to have every prospect of a useful and practical life. In 1915 he entered Prince of Wales College and qualified for 2nd class teacher. He taught with success at Seaview for one year, then re-entered college but health failed him and prevented him from prosecuting the course to the desired end. He remained home for a time to rest and resumed teaching at Greenwich, New London. He continued teaching until the beginning of 1920 when health again failed and from this attack he was unable to recover. He fought the good fight but his victory was not of this world. He died resigned to the destiny that must be met by the whole human race.

His funeral was held on March 19th and included a large number of friends who admired his striking qualities of mind and heart. The pall bearers were: Jas. L. Saunders, Albert McLellan; Jas. Pendergast; Kenneth McLeod, Harry Brander and Thos. Campbell. High Mass of Requiem was sung by the pastor, Mr. Gillis who also performed the services at the grave.

Wreaths were placed on the coffin by the pupils of Greenwich school, a Cross from the teacher and pupils of Irishtown school; the sympathy of the whole community is extended to the bereaved family in the sorrow caused by the death of one whose life seemed full of promise.
