LONDON, Aug. 8.—Premier Asquith announced in the House of Commons yesterday that on Wednesday he would state the attitude of government towards the resolutions of the allied economic conference.

Meanwhile a magnificent indicator of the trend of authoritative British feeling is given by the declaration of Sir Alfred Mond, M.P., who is a prominent member of the new British Government committee on the commercial and industrial policy.

Sir Alfred, who has always been pronounced a free trader, and is indeed treasurer of the Free Trade Union now says:

WORTH TWO NEUTRALS.

"Experience has taught us that every Canadian, Anzac or Africaner is worth more to us when we are fighting for our lives than two men in any neutral country, however benevolent."

"It would be criminal folly to let slip the opportunity afforded by the war of developing to the utmost the immense resources of the Empire, thus proving to the world that the inhabitants of the Empire are brothers in trade as well as in war."

GUARANTEE FAIR WAGE.

He insists, however, that the British tariff must include a special guarantee of adequate remuneration to labor, and a sufficient supply of protected articles for the home market at reasonable prices.
