No Further Taxes On N.S. Or N.B. Moviegoers

HALIFAX, May 19 (CP) - Premier Macdonald said today the Nova Scotia Government does not propose to impose any further taxes on amusements or pari mutuels this year.

In a prepared statement, the Premier said: "I am glad to see from the press reports of Mr. Abbott's budget speech last night that the Dominion Government has decided to withdraw from the amusement and pari mutual tax fields."

"In withdrawing from the amusement and pari mutual tax fields the Dominion Government is giving recognition to a principle for which the Provinces have long contended. That is, that certain fields of taxation which they formerly enjoyed exclusively should be returned to them for their exclusive use as soon as possible."

"In March, 1947, I stated in an address to the Nova Scotia Legislature that if the Dominion would abandon its tax on theatres and other places of amusement, on pari mutuels and electrically this Province would not impose any new or additional taxes in these fields for that year and probably not for several years, if ever."

"Sometime later Mr. Abbott... in a letter to me stated that he recognized the desire of the Province to have taxation fields of their own and that it would be the policy of the Dominion to vacate the amusement and pari mutual fields as soon as circumstances would permit."

"This Government will abide by the statement of March, 1947. It does not propose to impose any further taxes on amusements or pari mutuels this year."

Bunbury Farm Herd Featured In Holstein Journal

Outstanding animals bred on Premier J. Walter Jones' Bunbury Farm are featured in the current issue of the Holstein-Friesian Journal, the official organ of the Holstein-Friesian Association of Canada.

Abegweit widow, one of the main milk producers for the Premier, gets the most space in the Journal. Her record has qualified her for the coveted Blue Seal certificate.

Widow is not only an outstanding cow herself, her lifetime butter fat percentage is the best, save one, for a cow that has produced so much milk; but she is also the grand dam of the world champion butter fat producer Abegweit Milady.

The Journal summary of her achievements is as follows: Abegweit Widow 32045 (GM), great old brood matron in the herd of Hon. J. Walter Jones, Charlottetown, P.E.I., is reported with another good record as a 10-year-old to win a Blue Seal Certificate. These are her records in full:

2 yrs. 3x 16,911 milk, 4.41% 746 fat. 4 yrs. 3x 18,872 milk, 4.36% 815 fat. 6 yrs. 3x 18,586 milk, 4.08% 877 fat. 7 yrs. 3x 19,058 milk, 4.46% 843 fat. 8 yrs. 3x 20,697 milk, 4.57% 946 fat. 9 yrs. 3x 19,507 milk, 4.24% 831 fat. 10 yrs. 3x 17,965 milk, 4.10% 737 fat. 7 lactations 139,495 milk, 4.33% 5601 fat.

Her 6-year-old record was in the 305-day division. Only one other cow with so much milk has had such a high average test. That is Springbank Snow Countess whose lifetime average was 4.37%. She was sired by Raymondale Abegweit Chieftain 107549 (XX) whose 18 tested daughters have 49 records averaging 15,325 lbs. milk, 4.14%, 605 lbs. fat, 14 at 2 years, 8 at 3, 7 at 4, 20 mature, 12 in 305 days, 11 on 2x, the remainder on 3x. She is out of Abegweit Lady Frances 249533 (GM) who was junior champion at the C.M.E. in 1933 and was the main foundation cow in the present day Abegweit herd. As a junior 2-year-

old she produced 18,531 lbs. milk, 4.04% 748 lbs. fat on 3x. Widow's first offspring was Saladin, the sire of Milady, who is now owned by the Daisy Way Farms in New York State. Her next son was Dutchman sold to the Coporation de Pomento, Santiago, Chile; the third son, Iron Duke, is owned by Houck and Pindlay; another son Jack Pot, is now senior sire in the Abegweit herd. Also at Abegweit are two daughters, Goldust and War Baby, the latter an Honor List producer in 1947 and reported again this month with junior 3-year-old record of 12,703 lbs. milk, 4.66%, 592 lbs. fat. Another son, Widower, was sold in the Hays' Dispersal to Rolf Meyerheim of Uruguay.

References to Bunbury-owned and Bunbury-bred animals are frequent in the issue of the Journal. Malpeque Model Kornadyke Bell, for example, has completed a 3x record of 16,785 lbs. milk, 3.61%, 606 lbs. fat at 14 years of age. This improves her Blue Seal standing to an 11-lactation total of 147,044 lbs. milk, 5.773 lbs. fat. A Grand Champion at Halifax in 1937 she was bred by L.D. McNutt, Malpeque.

Another Bunbury Pann product, Abegweit Bachelor, has been imported recently by J.E. Houck, Brampton and H.P. Findlay, Edgemoor, Ontario, to replace Abegweit Iron Duke, another Bunbury Farm product, who was sold recently to the Wellington County Holstein Breeders Association.

Both of the sires are sons of Abegweit Widow whose most noted son is Abegweit Saladin who sold recently for \$3,000 at the advanced age of ten years. It was Saladin who sired the world

champion butter fat producer Abegweit Milady who is the pride of the Jones stable. Bachelor is a grandson of Abegweit Sparkie who produced 19,016 lbs. of milk, 4.56% butter fat at four years and is now one of the most noted of the aged cows on Curtis Candy Farms.

U. S. Automobile Strike May Spread DETROIT, May 18 (AP) - An unprecedented "double-barrelled" strike against two of the automobile industry's three largest producers in the United States drew one step nearer today.

The United Automobile Workers (U.A.W.), pressing their third work stoppage drive, filed a 10-day strike notice against General Motors Corporation, the industry's biggest manufacturer. A G. M. strike would shut more than 90 plants across the United States and make idle 235,000 employees, three times the number who have been on strike at 16 Chrysler Corporation plants for seven days.

BOMBING (Continued from Page 1) city attempted to bargain with the command of the Arab volunteers over surrender terms this morning. When no decision was reached, the Arab bombardment was resumed.

The entry of King Abdullah's Trans-Jordan Arab Legion into Jerusalem turned the tide of battle Tuesday. Outside the old city the Arabs have gained control of most of Mount Scopus on the north side for Hebrew University, and Hadassah Hospital, won Wadi El Joz below Mount Scopus and Herod's Gate, the Mount of Olives on the east and Mount Zion on the south except for a single Jewish-held position.

(Jewish military headquarters in Tel Aviv said Jewish troops broke through the Arab-held Zion Gate on the south Tuesday midnight and linked up with Jewish forces in the old city. In severe fighting the Jews broadened their breach in the Arab ring around the old city, headquarters said. Capture of nearby Mount Zion preceded the attack, the Jews declared.

(The army of Israel said it captured the huge former British army camp at Sarafand, 15 miles south-east of Tel Aviv, a strategic road fortress. It adjoins El Ramle, which was reported already under attack by Irgun Zvai Leumi fighters.)
