P.E. ISLAND WINNERS AT WINTER FAIR

Island Swine, Sheep and Cattle Made Splendid Showing Record Attendance at Fair Educational Lectures by Experts

(Special to The Guardian) AMHERST, N. S., Dec. 7.—Special prizes were awarded to-day at the Maritime Winter Fair which exceeded in attendance all fairs held in previous years, about 2,000 paid admissions being recorded at the ticket offices. The judging of cattle, sheep and swine was completed this afternoon. J. W. Calbeck, of Summerside, P. E. I., carried off the P. B. Evans Cup for the best pig of swine. He also secured the Atlas Stock Co. Cup for the best swine of any age at the fair. The W. W. Black Silver Cup for the best grade beef animal was captured by Forrest Bros., of Amherst, while the Masses Harris special for the best herd of the grade class was also taken by Forrest Brothers. In the International Harvester Co. special, the grand championship for the best beef animal was taken by Edward Anderson, of Sackville. In Leicester sheep A. Boswell won ten prizes; in Lincoln Albert Boswell French Fort, won ten prizes; J. Tweedie, Earncliffe, in Cotswolds won eight prizes; in poultry Albert Boswell won twenty prizes, A. H. Boswell, Marshfield, twelve, and J. W. Tweedie, fourteen prizes. M. Laird and Son took the Snow-hall Cup for best herd Short-horns, 4 females. This cup was won in 1914 by Harold Etter and in 1915 by J. M. Laird & Son. In Polled Angus, J. M. Laird & Son got 5 firsts, 5 seconds and 2 thirds. In Short-horn, M. Laird & Son won 3 firsts, 2 seconds and 3 thirds. Four lectures were given in the evening, all of educational advantage to the attending agriculturists. Messrs. Hubbard and A. E. FIGHTING IS NOW ON IN EARNEST

Along all Fronts Important Battles Begun or Impending. Turks Begin Attacks in Mesopotamia. Fight on in Serbia and Gallipoli.

(Special to The Guardian.) LONDON, Dec. 7.—Important battles have begun or are impending in Mesopotamia, where German Field Marshal Baron Von Dr Goltz has taken command of the Turkish forces and is about to attack the British at Kut el Amara in south-eastern Mesopotamia. Bulgarians have already attacked the Anglo-French positions and have been repulsed; on Gallipoli, where, according to Turkish accounts, the Allies have taken the offensive, and in Belgium and France, where, reports from Holland state, the Germans have concentrated strong reinforcements and an immense amount of artillery with the object of striking a blow at the Allied line; also in Flanders and Artois. Except in Serbia, the battles have not developed beyond the preliminary stages, as far as is known, artillery alone of the different arms being active. Along the Vardar, Cerna and Karaus front in Serbia the Bulgarians have already commenced their attack against the Anglo-French and it is reported that the German army of General Von Gallwitz has been reorganised and reinforced and is marching south to take part in the operations. It is the intention of the Germans to strike hard before the Allies, who continue to land troops at Saloniki, have completed their preparations. It is reported the Germans have 40,000 available. There is no indication of Bulgarian or Anglo-French strength, but one report says that five Allied divisions of nearly 100,000 men have been landed thus far. The battle, therefore, will be one of the greatest importance. According to the French all Bulgarian attacks have been repulsed, but the Germans claim that the French were compelled to give up positions at the junction of Vardar and Cerna rivers to avoid being enveloped.

EX-PREMIER VENIZELOS ASKS HIS FOLLOWERS NOT TO VOTE IN THE ELECTIONS

PARIS, Dec. 7.—Eleftherios Venizelos, ex-Premier of Greece, has issued a manifesto addressed in the name of the Liberal party to the people of his country advising abstention from voting in the forthcoming general elections. The manifesto was issued on November 21st, but its transmission by telegraph was prevented by the Greek government, and it reached Paris to-day by mail. The manifesto calls attention to the fact that the internal crisis was brought about solely by the wresting of power from those to whom the people had confided it at the last elections. "Day by day," says M. Venizelos, "the constitution is deformed into a simple scrap of paper, and we find ourselves at present in a deviation from our policies amounting to suppression of the constitutional regime." Ex-Premier Venizelos points out what he calls the entire absence of necessity or excuse for an appeal to the people for the second time in a few months amid the confusion of war. He declares the chamber of deputies overturned the Greek cabinet, not for the mere pleasure of exercising its opposition, and that it would have accepted the new cabinet with the sole exclusion of the minister who had insulted the chamber, and says: "In spite of the national representatives by the promotion of that minister to the highest grade at the royal court, and in spite of his maintenance in the reconstructed ministry, the opposition contented itself with declaring that it would abstain from the sessions." "The chamber had in view only the defence of its own dignity and had no intention of interfering with the passage of urgent laws. All those concessions were insufficient to turn the government from its direction to dissolve the chamber and to proceed with the elections while all the men in the kingdom who could be mobilized were under arms. "The ancient regime that was thought to have been abolished by the revolution of 1909 returned to life with the ministry of the month of February. Beaten in the elections, this regime concentrates all its forces to-day in a supreme effort to suppress the liberties of the people because it cannot live otherwise. "After calling attention to what he terms the difficulties that make fair elections impossible, M. Venizelos declares that the government is secretly arranging to have home on leave all mobilized men which it can count upon to vote for government candidates, while all the adversaries of the government are being refused leaves of absence. "The duty of the Liberal party," says the ex-Premier, "is not to participate in the political comedy, whose object is to prevent a manifestation of will national will to give an appearance which would be false that the elections were an approval by the people of the non-execution of the treaty of alliance, thanks to which Greece has extended her frontiers as far as Nestos." The Liberal party has no intention to abandon the struggle, and it would be a mistake to thus interpret its decision, says M. Venizelos, who adds that the party's object now is to prevent internecine strife and to leave questions at issue to be settled after the exterior crisis has passed. If the disasters now being prepared by the government do not take on such proportions that the faith in a future Hellenism be not entirely shaken."

RUSSIANS CAPTURE ENEMY AEROPLANE

(Special to The Guardian.) PETROGRAD, Dec. 7.—An official communication from general headquarters to-day says, Near the village of Krevo, south of Vilya River, we shot down an enemy aeroplane and captured its occupants. In the region of the village of Janovka, north-east of the town of Buczacz, the enemy, protected by violent artillery fire, endeavoured to advance eastward, but were repulsed towards the village of Delava. Equally successful were the enemy attempts to attack our troops near the villages of Zaylovez and Pyschokotze in Buczacz region, West of Lake Sventen, south of Vilya, near the village of Teubroff, north-west of Tarnopol our scouting party carried out a successful reconnaissance.

THE WAR TAXES HAVE BEEN A GREAT SUCCESS

Mr. White's Predictions are Exceeded. A HUGE TRADE BALANCE Canada Sound Financially.

OTTAWA, Dec. 7.—When Hon. W. T. White presents his budget at the next parliament the success of his war revenue measures, the complete fulfillment of his forecasts as to revenue and trade will place his critics of last session in a position where silence will be their only logical argument. In parliament and in the Liberal press for a few months following the war budget, the most gloomy and dismal forecasts of failure and incompetency were made. Through all these blue ruin prophecies in the party press was a note of gloom in that the supposed failure of the revenue measures would injure the government and none expressed a feeling of regret that our participation in the conflict might be retarded or modified by lack of funds. There has been no failure; the predictions have been proven ample and the critics who gleefully prophesied failure must find a new line of attack.

ANTICIPATIONS EXCEEDED.

Last session Mr. White estimated that under the existing revenue measures the government's income would be for the following fiscal year \$120,000,000. He proposed by special taxes and a horizontal rise in the tariff to increase the revenue by \$30,000,000, of which \$10,000,000 would come from special war taxes and \$20,000,000 from increased customs revenue. It is now evident that instead of failing to produce the \$150,000,000 revenue there will be over \$100,000,000 and that a comfortable surplus instead of a deficit will be the report of a finance minister. In the expenditure met out of the current revenue will be in excess of our war debt and our pension list. At the same time there has been a big increase in current expenditure.

SOCIALIST SPOUTER ARRESTED IN ST. JOHN

(Special to The Guardian.) ST. JOHN, Dec. 7.—That it is dangerous for professed Socialist orators, in St. John at any rate, to express derogatory opinions of His Majesty King George or of the movement to secure men for the Empire armies, was evidenced to-night by the arrest by Detectives Briggs and Barrett of Wilfrid Cribble, a Socialist orator, who for some months has held forth to the long haired brethren in Socialist Hall. Cribble held a meeting last Sunday night, in the course of which he referred to a recruiting placard freely displayed about the St. John streets reading "Your King and Country Need us." "By the way, that," he is reported to have said, "Your King and Country Bleed You." In the same discourse he referred to King George V. as "a puppet." One, George H. Worden, was among his listeners and he was so impressed with the incongruity permitting an orator of the Cribble type to inveigh against recruiting at a time when all efforts are being exerted to draw the young men into Khaki, that he wrote to Mayor Frink in complaint. The Mayor brought the matter up at this afternoon's meeting of the Commissioners and remarked that it was altogether inappropriate that in the city of the loyalists any man could refer to King George as "a puppet" and get away with it. Commissioner McLeellan of the Public Safety Department, on the estate of Mrs. L. A. Currey, widow of Dr. L. A. Currey, K.C., a prominent New Brunswick lawyer. After working a few weeks he married his employer. The case has attracted much attention as it is the first of the kind to come before the Courts in the Maritime Provinces.

GREEK AND ENTENTE POWERS TO CONFER

Greek Premier Explains Government's View on Situation and Conference Mutually Agreed Upon. Satisfactory Solution Now Assured.

(Special to The Guardian) ATHENS, Dec. 7.—An agreement for a conference of the Greek military authorities and military representatives of the Entente Powers to examine and report upon the necessities of the situation respecting allied demands upon Greece, has been reached and a preliminary step toward the holding of the conference has been taken, Premier Skoulioudis announced to-day. The Government of Greece has only two objects in view, the sovereignty of Greece and not abandonment of neutrality no matter what inducements or pressure are brought to bear on her. The situation is clearing. The Entente Powers are beginning to understand that while we are immovable on the two heads just stated, we are disposed in every other respect to give material expression to the feeling every Greek has towards Great Britain, France and Russia, dating from Navarino. The points which caused the recent conference are now clearing. As far back as November 10th, I suggested the inappropriateness of non-military diplomatists seeking to arrange details of a situation which they understood little. Therefore I proposed a conference between the military authorities on either side, authorized to study the necessities of the situation and report on them, thus giving the Greek Government and the Entente diplomatists the benefit of their conclusions from which a settlement could be reached. Respecting railroads the Greek Government has never been unaware that the personnel was inadequate to handling the immense increase in traffic due to the military uses to which the railways were put; but M. Bourail was unwilling to surrender control of his own property. As General Sarraill offers to assist in the operation of the railways, leaving the Greek control unquestioned, the Government is only too glad to accept. The question of hunting down Austro-German submarines in Greek territorial waters touches our sovereignty. We protest to the neutrals that we cannot sanction a violation of our territory. But what can we do? We have only a small navy and a vast coastline. We can only protest. What we want to avoid is associating Greece with an uncertain outcome of the war.
