Everyone should hear Prof. Wheelgon to-night on the King of musical instruments, the Pipe Organ. This will be the only opportunity of hearing him as he leaves for Toronto Thursday morning.

Neil McLeod, of Point Prim, received a telegram stating that his brother, Sam, died at Medical Lake, Washington, Oct. 18th. The remains left for his home at Point Prim on the 17th and are expected to arrive at Charlottetown on Monday, 24th. The deceased was about thirty years old and left home about ten years ago. The sudden news of his death came as a great shock to his mother, brothers and sisters.

A certain amount of dissatisfaction is felt by citizens and other patrons of the Charlottetown Steam Navigation Company by reason of the lack of proper accommodation for passengers at the wharf. The need of a waiting room seems to be more particularly felt in the evenings when numbers assemble at the wharf awaiting the return of friends or expecting visitors from abroad. This line of accommodation was keenly felt on one occasion recently when the boat was delayed in arriving here. At the usual hour a number who came there to meet friends gathered at the wharf, the way to which was not lighted till 8.30, and were obliged to stand outside in the darkness and freezing rain for a half an hour. The remedy for this would not be a difficult matter for the Company to accomplish and its patrons would highly appreciate any move they might make in this direction.

The travelling public in this Province will be interested in the following clipping from the St. John Telegraph: "The winter time table on the Intercolonial Railway will go into effect on Oct. 23. There is but little change from the schedule of last winter. The morning express No. 2 for Moncton and Truro will leave at 7 a. m., instead of at 7.10 as at present, and will make better time to Moncton, arriving there at 10.15, and as usual connecting with No. 55 express for Campbellton. No. 26 express known locally as the C. P. R., will, as last winter, run through to Halifax, leaving St. John at 12.40 as at present. No. 34, the connection the Maritime express, will leave as usual at 13.30. There is no change in the time of the night express for Halifax, No. 29, which will leave at 23.30. There will be no change in the springing time of the through expresses, except in the case of No. 133, the connection with the Maritime Express from Quebec and Montreal, which will arrive at 14.00 instead of at 10.40 as at present. The through expresses No. 3 and No. 4 between here and Point du Chene will go off the route until next summer.

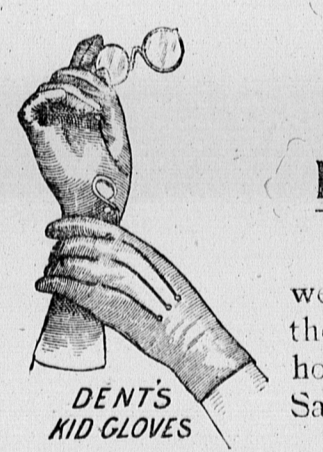
