Poultry for the English Market

SIR,—In looking over a late number of the Montreal Weekly Witness I noticed that Mr. Rudden of Liverpool had been to Ottawa and had made purchase of Canadian poultry to the amount of two million birds. He represents a company worth several million pounds, who are prepared to buy and pay the highest prices for all the Canadian poultry they can get, the sale in England being unlimited. The company at Ottawa intend to buy up all they can get during the winter and keep them in cold storage ready for spring shipment, when the prices are at the highest. I understand on good authority, that this Mr. Rudden came to Charlottetown about the first of September with the intention of making arrangements for the purchase of poultry, and for some unexplained reason left without doing anything in that line. I think that it is due to the farmers of the Province to know why those who are at the head of the Dominion poultry business in Charlottetown, did not try to make arrangements for the sale of some of our surplus poultry, and give some encouragement to our young men to start poultry raising a business that is offering such paying inducements to the farmers of the Dominion.

The First Chief Justice.

SIR,—Judge A. B. Warburton, in the P. E. I. special edition of the Halifax Herald gives an interesting sketch of the life of Prince Edward Island's first Chief Justice. His sketch however, covered but the latter part of his life. It is my purpose to write of that part of his life from the settlement of Halifax to his appointment as Chief Justice of Prince Edward Island. John Dupont was an English Attorney. In 1749 the expedition which was to found Halifax was formed. One of its members was John Dupont. The great majority of the settlers were soldiers or sailors, but among the few civilians were two who appear in the register of the first settlers as "gentlemen". Their names were John Dufort and Louis Piers. The first is the subject of my sketch. The settlers arrived at Chebucto, June 21st, 1749 (old style). On the 18th of the following month four Justices of the Peace were sworn in on board the "Beaufort", a transport on which the Government was transacted while quarters for the Governor were being built on shore. These four men were sworn in by Governor Cornwallis, J. P. for the township of Halifax. Dupont was the only legal man of the four. Mr. Ocller, one of the four acted as Chief Justice.

In 1752 Mr. Dupont was named as Judge of the Inferior Court of Common Pleas for the City and County of Halifax. He had associated with him several other men. On October 23rd, 1752, he was appointed Secretary or Clerk of the Council by Governor Hopson at a salary of £100 sterling per year.

In December of the same year, John Dupont along with the other justices of the Inferior Court of Common Pleas got in trouble. A charge sent in to the Council by a number of the most influential inhabitants, stated that partiality had been shown by them, and asked for a public hearing. On January 3rd, 1753 ten distinct charges against the Justices of the Inferior Court of Common Pleas were brought on for hearing before the Council.

Soon after this Mr. Dupont retired to the country for a time. It is not stated where he went but as he has been granted land a few miles down the harbour and was associated with others in a 14,000 acre grant on the Pisiquid River, he probably left the town to look after his properties in the country. Richard Burkeley who had been A. D. C. to Governor Cornwallis succeeded him as Clerk of the Council.

In Council 11th March, 1760 the Governor appointed fifteen Justices of Peace for the town and county of Halifax. John Dupont was one of the number. Five Justices of the Inferior Court of Common Pleas for the County of Halifax were appointed. Mr. Dupont was also one of the five. They were sworn in the same day by the Governor.

Mr. Dupont was instructed on the 9th September, 1766 to prepare a printed edition of the laws of the Province. About this time he was appointed 2nd, assistant Judge of the Supreme Court. This office he held in 1770 when he was sent to St. John's (now P. E. Island) as a Judge. He became the Island's Chief Justice not long after.

Mr. Dupont died on the 29th, January, 1774. He left a daughter married to Mr. P. Skeg of Falmouth, and a son who was in the army. His grandson was also an officer in the British Army. Judge Dupont was much esteemed by all.
