WINNIPEG, Feb. 25—May and July rye continued to show weakness in response to selling which was P. E. only light buying by owners on the Winnipeg grain exchange today, October, however, showed a firmer tone and closed higher.

CHICAGO, Feb. 25—(AP)—After a sharp break at the opening, May rye dragged along on mild rallies and fall-backs most of the time today, generally in sympathy with the Winnipeg market.

NEW YORK, Feb. 25—(AP)—Stocks suffered their sharpest break for more than 8 years in today's post-holiday market with leading stocks, motors, rails, liquor, utilities, "blue chips" and assorted industrials dropped 1-13 points in broad and active dealings.

MONTREAL, Feb. 25—(CP)—Losses predominated over gains by 3-1 in transactions on the stock exchange and curb market in one of the sharpest breaks in prices for years. Papers and liquors headed the downward plunge in which all key groups participated except banks which were a bit higher in the indices. Volume was higher than lately and numbers of stocks boarded was close to the record. Trends were fairly firm until levels in New York began to tumble.

BRITISH EXPORTS GROW

LONDON—(CP)—Sir Stafford Cripps disclosed in the Commons that in January exports had increased on an average for the preceding six months by 50 per cent.
