## OVERFLOW QUEEN'S COUNTY

Much sympathy was felt in Mount Hope when word was received that James A. He was in his 16th year and only left home in March to join his sisters and brothers, who had made their homes at Inntfall. He went from his home, in good spirits, the picture of health, and with a bright future before him in this world. The news of his death was a great shock to his parents and friends but it is a consolation to know that during his illness everything that kind friends, a skillful physician, and a trained nurse could do was done for him, and when he passed peacefully away his two sisters and two brothers were at his bedside. The funeral service was conducted by the Baptist minister in the church, after which the body was laid to rest in the People's Cemetery at Inntfall, there to await the resurrection morn.
