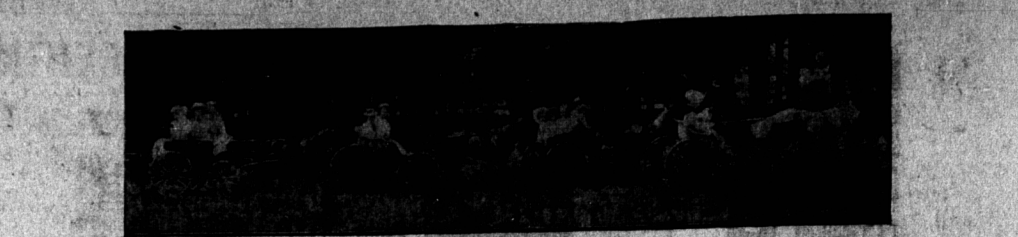

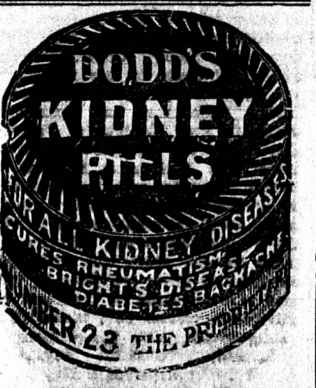
EASTERN PERSONALS

SCRAP BOOK

Many quaint and curious customs dating from ancient times are still observed in the Isle of Man, and not the least interesting of these is the ceremony that will be enacted today on Tynwald Hill. Men, women and children from all over the little island of the Irish sea will gather on the hillside and listen to the official who will read aloud the 'book of Manx laws. For centuries this archaic legal ceremony has been carried out on each fifth of July, except when that date falls on a Sunday, and it still retains most of the novel features that make it the most interesting observance of its kind to be witnessed anywhere in the world.
