SKATING ASSOCIATION WENT OUT OF EXISTENCE WITH A BANG

Covey, White, Legge, Resign at Convention. Charges of "Money" Will be Probed Amateur Head Says. Barnstorming is Also Hinted at.

The Maritime Skating Association went out of existence yesterday with a bang.

Its young life—birth notice appearing early last fall—was strangled at a meeting in the Board of Trade rooms when its sponsors pulled the ropes.

The executors were Frank White, president; P. J. Legge, secretary-treasurer; A. W. Covey, president of the M. P. B. A. U. of C., and E. McNutt, vice-president for New Brunswick.

These resigned from the executive of the association and there being no one to take their places the infant association passed away. There may be an inquest.

cial vehicles. Its use has now been extended by a British firm in connection with a road crane.

In the petrol-electric system the engine is used to drive a generator which, in turn, supplies electricity to the driving motors.

One great advantage of this system with the economy in power using the engine always running at an efficient speed.

In the new application referred to, the current supplied by the engine is used not only for driving the vehicle but for operating an electric crane mounted over the rear axle.

The crane is capable of lifting loads up to two tons and is intended for such services as placing pipes in trenches or for stacking heavy goods in a yard.

Where the load has to be carried for some distance, the crane deposits it in a trailer which is attached to the vehicle.

The mechanism is so simple and well designed that while the crane is in use no attention is needed for the engine; therefore, the driver of the vehicle can act as crane man.

A Novel Grinding Machine. The use of the grinding wheel for finishing castings and other portions of machinery has developed greatly within recent years.

One of the latest developments takes the form of a special machine for grinding articles which cannot be dealt with conveniently in the ordinary grinder.

The grinding wheel is placed horizontally and rotated at a high speed. The objects to be ground are placed on the top of the disc, the lighter objects being loaded so that they press with sufficient weight upon the grinding surface.

Various cross bars and other devices are used to hold the pieces to be ground in position. The grinding disc is actually made of steel very finely machined, and is used as a carborundum cloth.

A feature of the machine is that all the dust given off in grinding is collected under the machine, so that it does not mingle with the air and thus affect the health of the operators.

Then Came Bombshell Next came the bombshell, when the secretary read a letter from President Frank White, who stated that he was placing his resignation before the Maritime Amateur Skating Association.

At the request of the meeting, Charles Burpee was appointed Chairman while the members dealt with the resignation, and after reading the same Secretary Legge stated that it was with deep regret that Mr. White was called on to take this action.

The association was losing the best man that could possibly be obtained, that Mr. White knew the skating game thoroughly and was a man who was esteemed by all in the athletic line.

Mr. Sheehan said that he regretted very much that Mr. White was resigning as it disrupted the whole organization and without Mr. White as the leading officer the Association would find it difficult to conduct business.

Mr. Sheehan then pointed out that if the Maritime Association was defunct the Canadian Board at Montreal would again be in control.

Mr. Covey informed the meeting that the Dartmouth, N. S. Club, and the Wanderers of Halifax had asked him to hand in the resignations as affiliated bodies with the Maritime Association.

Mr. Legge showed that there was \$28 in the association's funds and about \$42 outstanding and that the St. John Rowing Club, Y. M. C. I., and Rotary Club were about the only ones that had paid their affiliation fees.

Mr. Covey then placed his resignation before the meeting and on motion of Mr. White, seconded by Mr. Legge, the resignation was accepted.
