A large number of friends and relatives on the Island will regret to learn of the death of Mrs. Macdonald Boulter of Cloverdale, B. C. which occurred at her home on Wednesday morning, July 11, 1946. Mrs. Boulter who was Lelia Lobban Leard, fourth daughter of the late Charles N. and Millicent Howatt Leard was born August 11, 1866 at Trym, P. E. I. where she spent her early years. She was married on September 21, 1887 to J. B. Macdonald Boulter who survives her. A charter member of the Baptist Church in Cloverdale where she and her husband had been residents for twenty-four years. Mrs. Boulter who is greatly missed as an active church worker. Despite a handicap of failing sight Mrs. Boulter continued to take her part in the home until a week previous to her decease when injured by a fall which was the cause of her death. SOUTH AFRICA AIDS "CAN-OPENER" WIVES
CAPE TOWN, August 13.—(CP)—"Can-opener" wives have created one of the biggest domestic problems in South Africa to-day. Husbands are finding their newly-wed wives incapable of boiling an egg or cooking a cauliflower.

During the war thousands of girls who left school went straight into the army or took up business posts away from home. Now they are getting married or returning to homes of their own with no experience in the kitchen.

The South African Department of Agriculture regularly issues pamphlets dealing with the best ways of preparing food for the table.

Regulations provide that a meal may not exceed three courses—soup, fish or meat and sweet. If bread is served, another course must be foregone.
