"No School Today" in France and Belgium, as Children Become Educated to Horrors of Total War



The name of the town is unknown and there is no report whether the infant escaped or was killed when a German bomb ripped the side from this Belgian house (left), leaving a baby carriage standing on the rickety platform which a few moments before was the floor of a room. Too many children are being left homeless, if they themselves aren't hit, for individual names to figure in the terrible news of air raids on the Belgian battleground. "No school today," was scribbled in chalk on the side of a schoolhouse in Nancy (right), later a rail there — one of the first French cities to be bombed and which has been attacked repeatedly since.
