Premier Campbell On The Prohibition Act

Much interest has been taken in the lengthy speech by Premier Campbell in the Legislature last week on the Prohibition Act. He made a report of his opening remarks: "For the past three years or so."

Summerside Town Council "This was, I believe so much the case that the Town Council of Summerside recently requested the Government of the Province to enact some measure of Prohibition."

Made More Drastic "The Province has made more drastic in its provisions the prohibition of intoxicating liquor."

"Nothing of the Sort" "Because, Mr. Speaker, it would be foolhardy of me or of any other responsible public man to state or promise that the Prohibition Act, as it stands, would be enforced 100 per cent."

THE 1937 Election Premier Campbell went on to review events up to the general election of 1937, when the Stewart Government went to the country on a program of government control.

Prohibition in one form or another has been the law in Prince Edward Island since the turn of the century. From 1900 to 1911 the law was more or less constant, allowing liquor to be dispensed and sold from the sale of medical doctors, the sale being carried on chiefly through the druggists.

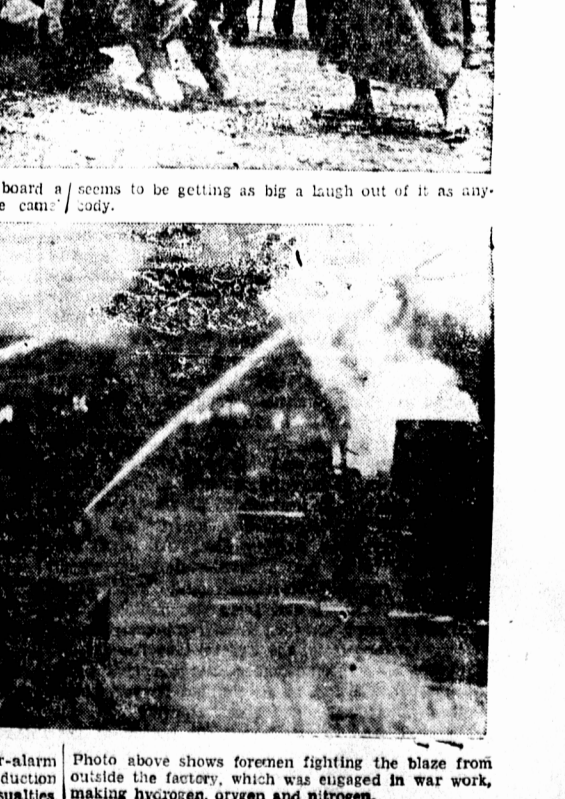
