ORANGE WHIP

1 1/2 cups boiling water
1/2 cup granulated sugar
2 tablespoons corn starch
2 eggs, separated
1 cup orange juice
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1 teaspoon grated orange rind

Cook's Corner

Combine the boiling water and sugar in upper pan of double boiler; bring to the boil, stirring until the sugar dissolves; boil 3 minutes.

Combine the corn starch and salt; add to the cold water. Stir into the hot syrup and cook, stirring constantly, until smoothly thickened; cover and cook, stirring occasionally, until no raw flavor of starch remains.

Beat the egg yolks slightly and slowly stir in part of the cooked corn starch mixture; return to upper pan of double boiler and cook over boiling water, stirring constantly, for 1 minute.

Remove from heat and stir in orange juice, lemon juice and orange rind. Cool to lukewarm.

Beat the egg whites until stiff, but not dry and fold into cooled pudding. Turn into individual dessert glasses and chill for serving.

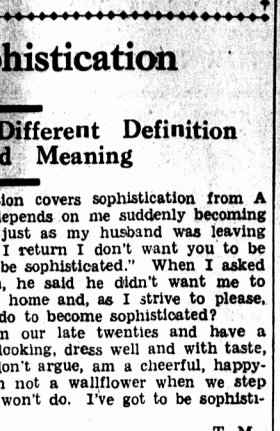
