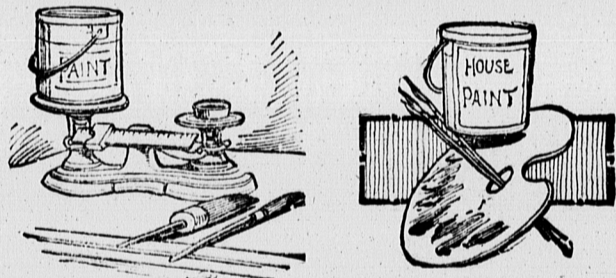

INTERESTING SPRING ATTRACTIONS AT THE EDEN MUSEE.

The management of the Eden Musee of New York City, has arranged a special series of attractions for the Spring season, which will make the Musee an unusually interesting amusement place. The large group in the Central Hall, representing Roosevelt shooting lions in Africa, has been remodelled to await the return of the great hunter. The Naval and Military Heroes of all countries have been given new costumes, and several new figures have been added. The life-like figure of General Kitchener is attracting much attention on account of the visit to this country of this distinguished soldier. Many other new figures and groups have been added to the already large wax collection. In the Winter Garden, Hews, the White Yogi, or Master of Hindoo Magicians, is making an unusual success. His feats of magic and skill are astounding, and at each afternoon and evening performance, there are present, representatives of the Magicians' Society, who are vainly endeavoring to solve his mysteries. Interesting moving pictures are received weekly from the great European centres of this great industry. They include interesting current events, reviews by Kings and Queens, reproductions of historical events, comic and mysterious pictures. Each hour, afternoons and evenings, the different series is shown, and visitors can see as many pictures as they desire. The Roman Quintette has been secured for the afternoon and evening concerts. This is the first appearance in this country of this celebrated orchestra, which is made up of individual artists.

BURNED BUNKS TO RAISE STEAM

NEW BEDFORD, Mass., April 25—To the combustible quality of the fittings of the Portuguese packet steamer Pescado, 115 immigrants who took passage on the steamer from the Cape De Verde Islands, owe their safe arrival here today. For the past three days, since the bunker coal supply gave out, the Pescado's engines have been fed on partitions, portions of the immigrants' bunks, much of the below decks fittings, and parts of the lower deck structure. This fuel kept the engines running until anchorage beside the Hen and Chickens light vessel was reached last night.

When a pilot was picked up there this morning, it was necessary again to resort to the immigrants' bunks for fuel. The steam generated was sufficient to bring the vessel to port. Had the immigrants to pass another night at sea, it is probable that few would have the usual sleeping quarters.

HEIR TO DUKEDOM IS SHORT OF CASH.

LONDON, April 25—The court granted today the application of Lord Francis Hope for sanction to sell certain pictures and jewels which are heirlooms. Lord Francis, whose first wife was May Yohé, the singer, whom he divorced in 1902, is the brother and heir presumptive of the Duke of Newcastle. He assumed the additional name of Hope by royal license.

Two years after his divorce from May Yohé, who married Putnam Bradlee Strong, a son of the former Mayor of New York, he married Olive Miriel Thompson, the daughter of a Melbourne banker. In his petition Lord Francis said that his present income, which is about \$15,000 a year, is not sufficient for himself and wife and family, and he demanded permission to sell twenty of the pictures, a conditional deal on which had been made for \$123,750. The Duke of Newcastle, through his solicitors, opposed the application. He objected especially to the proposed sale of the well known painting of the Duchess of Newcastle, his ancestress, by Sir Joshua Reynolds. The court over-ruled the objection.

THIRTY-NINE CANDIDATES CONFIRMED AT TRURO.

TRURO, April 25—The rite of confirmation was performed by Bishop Worrell in St. John's Church here tonight. There were thirty-nine candidates. A very large congregation was present during the service. The Bishop's address was on the subject of "Duty." The music was of a high class and appropriate to the occasion. Ven. Archdeacon Kauback and Rev. Mr. Bowman assisted at the confirmation exercises. The increase in membership, and the interest taken by the younger people in the church, has been a matter of considerable remark during the past few years. The church is progressing greatly and is more than holding its own with other denominations.

VAN HORNE RETIRES WELL SPENT CAREER.

MONTREAL, April 26—Sir William Van Horne announced yesterday that he had resigned as chair of the board of directors of the C. P. R. He said that he would retain a seat on the board, but he was getting old, and intended withdrawing as much as possible from active work.

DIRIGIBLE BALLOON SPOILED.

LIMBURG, April 26—Zeppelin 2, one of the three dirigible balloons of the German Government aerial fleet, ran away yesterday and was destroyed. The airship was forced to descend owing to a storm encountered while attempting a return from Mamburg to Cologne.

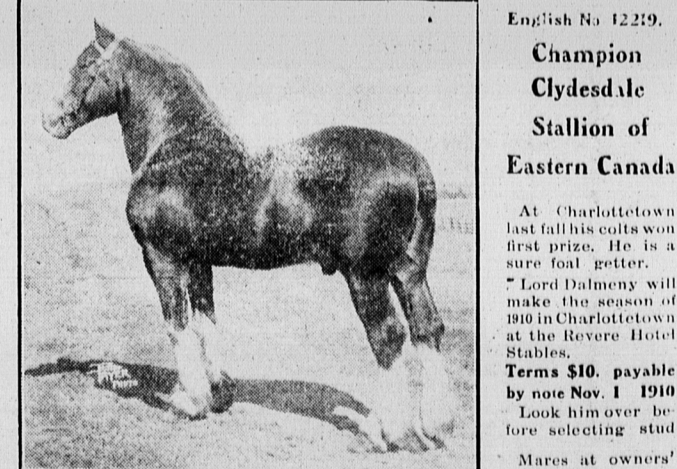
