ANARCHISTS AND ANARCHISM.

Anarchism, while it has obtained a hor-
rible notoriety from its avowed and
practiced doctrine of the assassination
of rulers, is not in this country very
generally understood. It owes its origin
and early development to Pierre Joseph
Proudhon, who was born at Besancon,
France in 1809 and died in 1855. Proudhon
was the son of a cooper, but managed
to obtain a liberal education, and from
1843 to 1847 was employed in a commercial
house at Lyons. At the outbreak of the
great revolution of 1848 he became promi-
nent in the socialistic propaganda of the
time, became popular, founded several
short-lived newspapers in Paris, was
elected to the Constituent Assembly, was
afterwards imprisoned and fled to
Belgium, but under the Republic was
allowed to return to France.

The doctrines taught by Proudhon, him-
self an advanced Socialist are the doc-
trines of Anarchism today. An eminent
writer on Socialism tells that Proudhon
taught absolute individual liberty, free
from all restraints of government or law.
Proudhon said that "the true form of the
state is anarchy," meaning by anarchy
of course not positive disorder, but the
absence of any supreme ruler, whether of
king, convention or parliament. His
followers have extended the system to
mean the overturn by violence of all
constituted forms and institutions of
society and government, all law and order
and all rights of property, with no purpose
of establishing any other system of order
in the place of that destroyed.

On this foundation has been developed
the most dangerous and damnable orga-
nisation that ever existed on earth. Its
conclaves, most numerous in France and
Italy, have also a foothold in most civil-
ized countries. They proclaim death to
all rulers, select assassins to murder
emperors, kings and presidents, and the
selected agent must do or attempt the
deed assigned him under penalty of death
at the hands of his fellows. It is not for
freedom that Anarchists contend but for
the abolition of all restraint by Govern-
ment or law. Hence the President of a
republic is as obnoxious to them as a
hereditary sovereign. Hence the fact
that two of their most conspicuous vic-
tims have been President Carnot of
France and President McKinley of the
United States. King Humbert and the
late Empress of Austria also fell by
Anarchist assassins.

The Nihilists of Russia, a revolutionary
body confined to that country, are similar
in doctrine and practice to the Anarchist
of Southern and Central Europe. Tolstoi,
in his My Religion says: "For thirty-five
years of my life I was in the proper
acceptation of the word a Nihilist—not a
revolutionary Socialist, but a man who
believed in nothing." The Nihilist rejects
all the positive beliefs upon which
existing society and Governments are
founded and demands the abolition of the
existing social and political order of

things. The outcome of this doctrine is
the succession of plots against the lives of
the Czars and of high officials of the
Russian Empire, which in the case of the
late Czar Alexander II resulted in his
death.
As is well-known a coterie of Anarchists
have for some years past been collected in
Chicago and another at Paterson, New
Jersey. They have been permitted to
openly proclaim and advocate the
doctrines of Anarchism, to hold public
meetings and disseminate their literature.
It was at Paterson that the death of
King Humbert was plotted, and from
that city Bresci was sent on his too fatal
mission to kill the King of Italy. Ameri-
can love of liberty and free speech is some-
thing which all British people can warmly
appreciate, but tolerance of Anarchism
has nurtured a viper in the midst of the
Republic which has now struck a deadly
blow at the nation's head. It would seem
that the time for tolerance of this sort
has passed.
