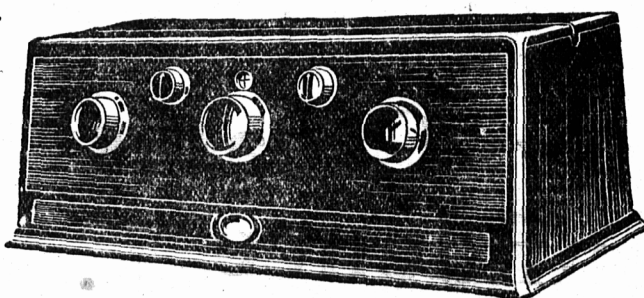

SWORD IS PROOF THESE PEOPLE MAY CAST VOTE

GLARIS, Switzerland, Nov. 16.—The family sword which he brings with him to the polls is proof of a citizen of the Cantons of Glaris, Appenzel, Unterwald and Lemmeiz in the Swiss cantons. The family sword has been lost, the voter appears with a bayonet. His vote is never challenged.

On election days inhabitants of these cantons meet in the open air and discuss the event. Bearing the swords their fathers, grandfathers or earlier ancestors used in defense of their country, the gathering resembles mobilization for war much more than a political meeting.

It is a republic for more than a thousand years. Switzerland is a country of ancient traditions. The elections of these four cantons meeting to discuss a referendum on the question of the sales of wine and beer, do so with all the warlike setting of their forefathers.

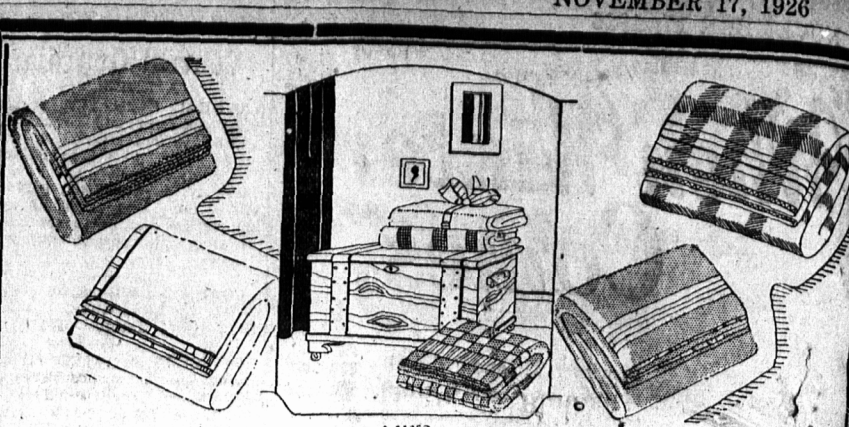
