## THE CAPITAL OF THE WEST

Latest From Summerside and Prince County.

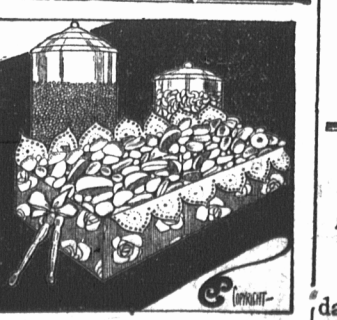

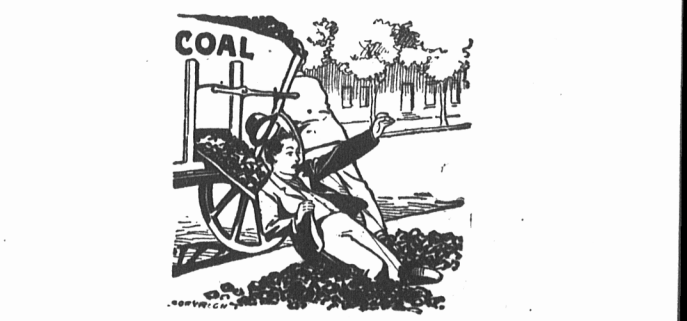
