NEW YORK, March 15—A grand jury today in Brooklyn found an indictment of murder in the first degree against Winifred Ankers, a hospital attendant, who was arrested for killing infants by putting an acid in their milk. Nine deaths resulted. The Ankers girl pleaded not guilty before Judge Fawcett and was remanded for trial. A commission inquired into her sanity, but has not reported.

Militiamen in this Province, and more especially those who have attended camp at Petewawa, will be interested in the following despatch from Ottawa—It is understood that the militia department will shortly announce an increase in the allowance of cooks in camp. The pay of cooks for the 16 camp days last year was \$1 a day. It has been stated that this is to be increased to \$1.50 a day. The proposed increase is the result of a general protest from the officers of the various corps in camp. It is stated that last year local officers in command of companies at Petewawa had to pay from their own pockets from \$2 to \$2.50 a day to their cooks. The allowance was only \$1 a day and in many cases officers could not get cooks for their companies at this price. They demanded from \$3 to \$4 a day, and the officers had to foot the difference. The companies of every corps have their own cooks and several of the officers commanding companies paid as high as \$50 from their own pockets to procure good cooks for their men.
