The death took place at Chemainus B. C. on Dec 10th, 1909, of Catherine, widow of the late Dominian Gallant, formerly of Rustico. The deceased lady left P. E. The death of Angus McDonald took place in his home in Springton, on the 13th of December, after a lingering illness, in the 76th year of his age. The deceased had been an exemplary Christian from his youth, being a consistent member of the Presbyterian church for over 50 years. The funeral which was largely attended was conducted at the home and grave by the pastor, Rev John Gillis. He leaves a wife, seven of a family, and four sisters, to cherish his memory. The remains were laid to rest in Springton cemetery. The pall-bearers were: Wm. McDonald, Angus McDonald, Arthur McEhon, Jerome Smith, Donald McKenzie and Donald McKay.
