Second ship Fire of week In New York

NEW YORK, Aug. 22 (AP) - The second ship fire of the week here was an estimated \$50,000 damage today to the 466-ton Finnish freighter Aurora and took the life of the ship's chief officer.

Meantime, the death toll in Monday's Brooklyn water front fire, which destroyed the Cuba mail line cargo ship Panuco, mounted to 30 with the recovery of 11 more bodies from the East River.

After inspecting the ship with police officials, the Finnish Consul General, T. O. Vaheruiori, said there was no evidence of sabotage, and expressed belief that fire started in the pantry.
