Property

The property of the Company now consists of four pairs breeders Black Silver Foxes, (pedigreed "Royal Blacks") The original pairs were selected from the Dalton and Frank Tuplin ranches, and the Company confidently believe they have a quality of foxes equal to the very best. They have proved very prolific, the increase in your last year being two hundred and fifty per cent. The Company also own their own Ranch at Seal River, splendidly situated, fully equipped in the most up-to-date manner, the outside boundaries enclosing three acres, allowing ample room for extensions. The Ranch is under the management of Mr. W. A. Jenkins, who has had several years' experience in breeding foxes, and who has been very successful. Mr. Jenkins is paid a fixed salary for his services and a fixed amount per head for feeding the foxes. No other salaries, commissions or per centages being paid anybody, consequently the Company's foxes are being maintained at the lowest possible cost, and therefore the shareholders will participate to the last possible dollar in the earnings of the foxes.

SECRETARY LANE MADE "BIG INDIAN."

WASHINGTON, March 13—Franklin K. Lane, Secretary of the Interior has been made an Indian Chief. Today in his office, he had bestowed upon him the title of "Lone Chief" by a delegation of Blackfoot Indians from Montana, who called to present to him a peace and a buckskin tobacco pipe.

After the pipe had been handed to him, Chief Curly Bear, a tall, heavy mountain chief, stepped forth and said:

"Hereafter we will call you Lone Chief. That was the name of our most famous chief. You will be Lone Chief to us now."

Then, turning to the Acting Commissioner of Indian Affairs Abbott, he said, "And you too must have an Indian name. You are short of stature, so we will call you Little Chief."

"I take your pipe," said the Secretary, "as a pledge between us. I know what it means. It is a promise on your part that you will bear faith to me, and when I shake your hand and take your pipe, it means that I bear good faith and good will toward you. I have spoken to the Great Father in the White House about you. You have a good friend in him, one who will always keep his word. I speak for him and promise that we always will try to do justice to you."

To the Secretary's little daughter, Miss Nancy Lane, who has become much interested in Indians, Chief Little Dog of the Blackfeet presented a pair of moccasins, decorated with beadwork.

Chief Plenty Coups, head of the Crow Indians, gorgeously arrayed for the occasion in red trousers and an immense headpiece of feathers, presented to Miss Nancy a beautiful pair of buckskin gloves, covered with fine beadwork as a token of his friendship.

"I give these to you," he said, "as the daughter of our father, who will look out for the Indians' interests." Plenty Coups is the Indian whose strong features are seen on the new \$5 banknotes.
