As the open season for teal, ducks, plover and shore birds commences today, Aug. 20th, the Game Inspector requests attention called to the following provisions of the Game Act, 1906, viz: The shooting of teal or black ducks between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, or with the assistance of lights, is prohibited. Non-residents must not shoot before taking out a game license. No game in this province, other than wild geese or brant, may be exported. Woodcock or snipe must not be killed before October 1st, nor rabbits until September 1st. Caution: The shooting of partridges is prohibited until October 1st, 1906. Any one knowing of any violations of the Game Act, is requested to notify the Game Inspector whose address is box 178, Charlottetown.
