DEBATE IN REPLY TO THE SPEECH

Local Legislature in Session Yesterday Afternoon and Evening—Speeches by Members in Reply to Lieutenant Governors Speech Inshore Fisheries To Be Protected

House met at 4 p. m. yesterday. A motion was made by Mr. Warburton that a Bill for the Better Protection of Game be read a first time and set down for second reading today.

The House was resolved into committee of the whole to consider the draft address in reply to the speech.

Mr. Agnew said that all agree we should be thankful that Divine Providence has blessed us. With reference to the visit of the Governor General he was glad that the Consolidated Schools had been singled out for attention.

John McMillan followed and touched upon the different points emphasizing the remarks made by Mr. Agnew. With regard to education he felt strongly that the teachers of today did not impart as much knowledge as the teachers of a generation ago.

The Leader of the Opposition after referring to the importance of the education question, spoke of subsidies and Fishery Award. All we have left he feared is hope.

DELIBERATIONS OF THE DOMINION PARLIAMENT

Jews in Russia—Political Morals—Electoral Law Improvements—Cigarette Legislation—Patent Medicine Bill—All These Discussed By Federal Law Makers—Government Accepts Opposition Leaders Motion Regarding Election Law Revision.

OTTAWA, March 15.—(Special)—The state of the Jews in Russia and the quality of political morals in Canada were the chief topics in the Commons today but there was no definite expression on either point.

There was promise of anti-cigarette legislation, patent medicine bill, electoral law revision and telephone control. The Government accepted the motion of the Opposition leader for a committee to make over the electoral laws.

Mr. Borden recommended the publication of the election expenditure, the limitation of expenses, appointment of public prosecutor and prohibition of savoffs and bribes to constituencies.

The Minister of Justice said he agreed with Mr. Borden on practically every point and promised to frame a strong law after full study of matter by Committee. He especially insisted on the prevention of unfairness in making electoral lists.

THE CASHIER OF DOM. EXPRESS CO. Held for Forgery and Defalcation—Others May be Implicated.

ST. JOHN, March 15.—(Special)—Harry B. White, acting cashier of the Dominion Express Co. here was arrested today, charged with forgery.

It is rumored that the defalcations cover a considerable amount and that others of the staff are implicated. The officials engaged in the investigation are reticent.

He was glad immigration was to be encouraged and that arrangements were being made to make known the advantages of the Province in Great Britain.

House adjourned till 10 o'clock today.

THE LEGISLATURE OF ALBERTA

Opened With Great Ceremony—A Number of Important Bills Introduced

EDMONTON, March 15.—(Special)—The first session of the first legislature of Alberta opened today with great ceremony.

The speech from the throne spoke of the establishment of Government creameries and for exhibitions, provision for public telephone service and many other bills which will make a long session if all are introduced.

ARMY WILL NOT BE REDUCED

LONDON, March 15.—(Special)—The Commons today by a large majority rejected the motion to reduce the army by ten thousand men.

INTERESTING NEWS FOR MILITIA MEN

LONDON, March 14.—A review of veterans who took part in the Crimean and Mutiny campaigns will be held by the king in June at Buckingham palace.

The Broad Arrow says: "We are rapidly becoming the military leaders of fashions among the nations of Europe. Our khaki and smasher hats have been copied all round. The French infantry soldier has disguised his extremities in putties, and now the French are seriously proposing not to let their infantry officers carry swords on active service."

Whether a longer bayonet than the present 1903 pattern should be used for the new short rifle is the subject of an inquiry now being made by the Imperial war office.

X battery, R. H. A., attached to the cavalry brigade at Aldershot, is to be the first battery in the British army to be fully equipped with the new quick-firing guns, orders having been issued to this effect.

SUDDEN DEATH OF LT. GOV. JONES

HALIFAX, March 15.—Hon. Alfred Gillip Jones, the venerable Lieut. Governor of Nova Scotia, died shortly before two o'clock this morning. Little intimation of the sudden summons was given to his family and household. He retired at the usual hour last night and slept tranquilly until 12.30 o'clock, when he awoke complaining of pain. Two doctors were hastily summoned to his bedside, but he was stricken with apoplexy and expired peacefully in a short time after.

SUPERINTENDENT OF INSURANCE

Says Company Refuses Names of High Salaried Officials—No Power to Punish Them for Buying Forbidden Securities—Condemns Assessment Companies

OTTAWA, March 15.—(Special)—Supt. Fitzgerald continued his evidence before the Insurance Commission today. Some companies, he said, had refused to give the names of their officials receiving more than a thousand dollars a year. There is no power to punish companies for dealing in unauthorized securities. An interesting development was the disclosure that he has little control over

the securities of the companies. The present Act specifies what they shall levy but provides no punishment for violations of these provisions. He condemned the assessment companies and recommended that this system be forbidden. He admitted he had made no effort to find out what the companies are doing between their annual statements.

ZION'S AFFAIRS IN A BAD WAY

CHICAGO, March 14.—John Alexander Dowie has become a secondary figure, while officials of his church in Zion City are striving to hold together the fiscal affairs of the institution and prevent it from complete wreck.

It was reported that urgent private cable messages sent to the "Apostle" in Jamaica had been returned undelivered. It became an open secret that Deputy Overseer Voliva had cut loose from Dowie and was defying many of the Apostle's cherished rules. It was said that Dowie was no longer the active head of the church. In addition to the question, "Where is Dowie?" these questions were in many mouths: "What has become of the private book-keeper who kept the ledgers mounted with brass locks and opened only at the command of Elijah? Why was it necessary to forcibly open the secret office in the Zion Administration building yesterday, in which the vanishing bookkeeper kept tab on all incoming subscriptions, tithes and the like?"

SERIOUS PHASE OF SCHOOL QUESTION

WINNIPEG, March 13.—The Western Banner, a new organ of the Orange order contains an article headed: "Warning to Manitoba government," in which it refers to the charge made by a public man that there are, today, in the province of Manitoba, public schools, so called, supported out of the public funds, controlled by the department of education and whose teachers are certificated by the department of education, which are Roman Catholic to all intents and purposes and call on the grand lodge to investigate these charges.

"If there are such schools, and if the public act of this province is being evaded in this disgraceful manner," declares the paper, "then the time has arrived when the Orangemen of Manitoba, without respect to party, should hurl his government from power at the next opportunity. The government cannot attempt to ride both the Protestant horse and the apostolic ass."

A NEW BAYONET IS ASKED FOR

LONDON, Mar. 14.—It has now been finally decided that the whole army shall be armed with the short Lee-Enfield rifle.

This decision has given rise to several important considerations, one of the most important of which concerns the length of the bayonet. When the long rifle was issued to the troops the size of the bayonet was reduced to the famous cheese-knife pattern. The result is that when this bayonet is fitted to the new short rifle the British soldier is at a considerable disadvantage so far as length of reach is concerned, when compared with the soldiers of foreign nations.

A rod bayonet is unpopular, and the general trend of army opinion, which is being given at the solicitation of the war office, is that six inches should be added to the length of the cheese-knife.
