## CHURCH BURNED BY LIGHTNING

Catholic Edifice in Carleton, St. John Struck by a Bolt, Loss \$50,000—Rain Prevents a Conflagration—New Brunswick's Oldest Barrister Dead—Practised 58 Years.

**CHURCH BURNED BY LIGHTNING.**  
St. John, Oct. 26.—[Special]—During a heavy electrical storm this afternoon the Church of the Assumption, Carleton, was struck by lightning and burned to the ground.  
**THE HEAVY LOSS.**  
The loss is \$50,000 and is only partially covered by insurance.  
The bolt struck the belfry and in an instant the whole steeple was afire.  
**BEYOND THE FIRE LIMITS.**  
The structure being beyond city limits has no fire protection and it was some time before the city firemen came to the rescue and by hard work they saved the rectory.

**RAIN CHECKED ITS SPREAD.**  
The heavy downpour averted a serious conflagration.  
Father J. J. Donovan is Rector. All the altar furnishings were saved.  
**AGED LAWYER'S SUDDEN DEATH.**  
NEWCASTLE, N. B. Oct. 26.—[Special]—Samuel Thomson, K. C. the oldest practicing Barrister in New Brunswick, died suddenly today.  
**THE SURVIVING RELATIVES.**  
A widow, three sons and five daughters survive, one of whom is Mrs. W. E. Stavert, wife of the Bank of New Brunswick Manager.  
Mr. Thomson was admitted to the Bar, Oct. 10, 1846.

## "ARE WORKING ON A SEBASTOPOL."

Russian Garrison Confident it Can Withstand Siege Until Baltic Fleet Arrives.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 25.—A telegram received by the family of Naval Architect Kuznetsov, now at Port Arthur, dated Oct. 14, and sent by way of Chelof, says: "All well. Do not be disheartened. We are working on a Sebastopol."  
A correspondent learns that the Baltic fleet will proceed to the Far East at a slow economical speed. There is no intention to have the fleet arrive there until February. The Admiralty expects the garrison of Port Arthur to hold out until then. According to calculations, if the garrison holds out another six weeks, the fierce north-east gales which then begin will sweep the Yellow Sea, and constitute such a danger to the Japanese warships that it will compel Admiral Togo to relax his blockade, and the garrison will be able to secure a fresh supply of war munitions and food.

## MORGAN BACKS MR. ROOSEVELT

The Standard Oil Concern is for Parker  
Millionaire Lawson of Boston Makes Sensational Charge Against Rockefeller and Others.

New York, Oct. 25.—Thomas W. Lawson, the Boston millionaire stockholder, formerly partner of H. H. Rogers, and business associate of the Standard Oil ring, who in a magazine article last week made sensational charges that the "Standard Oil crowd" were raising a huge fund to carry Judge Parker in as president, supplemented his first charges in a signed statement issued yesterday. It is J. P. Morgan, the bitterest foe of the oil trust magnates, Lawson says, who is backing Roosevelt. He continues: "There will be two or three explosions between now and the time the votes are counted that will give things a shaking up, and perhaps—perhaps—well, I cover it when I say that it will not do for Roosevelt or his lieutenants to sleep or even take a nap between now and election day."  
Lawson's attack is in part confirmed by a story in The Evening Globe, which asserts that large financial interests, hostile to President Roosevelt, have satisfied themselves that Judge Parker's election is still among the possibilities and have as a result, replenished the Democratic treasury. A week ago their emissaries who were conducting the investigation reported that while the balance was at present in favor of Roosevelt, time and money might turn the scale. Then the coffers were opened.  
Seen by The New York American the various parties implicated in Lawson's charges returned the following replies:  
J. P. Morgan: His message said: "Mr. Morgan does not care what anybody says about him."  
E. H. Rogers: Miss Harrison, his private secretary, said in anger: "Take this thing—take it! Mr. Rogers is engaged, but if he were not I know he would not even read such stuff, let alone comment upon it."  
John D. Rockefeller: A representative said: "Mr. Rockefeller does not care to comment on the statements of Mr. Lawson or any other person."  
James Stillman: "You know we never answer such attacks."  
Senator McCarren: Wrathful, refuses to answer the charges made against him.

## RUSSIAN OFFICERS SAY THEY SAW TORPEDO BOATS

And Suspected a Japanese Attack, Did Not Know they Hurt Anybody and Sorry—British Warships Moving, Watching Gibraltar Straits and Lay Follow Russian Ships

**BRITISH WARSHIPS MOVING.**  
GIBRALTAR, Oct. 26.—[Special]—The first-class battleships Victorious, Illustrious and Majestic, the latter the flagship of Vice-Admiral Beresford, and the first-class cruisers Lancaster, Theseus and Endymion are under orders to sail Oct. 26th.  
**TO SHADOW THE BALTIC FLEET.**  
It is reported that the purpose is to shadow the Russian Baltic squadron which is expected go by way of the Cape of Good Hope.  
**TORPEDO FLOTILLA COMMISSIONED.**  
The whole of the Gibraltar torpedo flotilla has been commissioned.  
**RUSSIAN OFFICERS EXPLAIN.**  
MADRID, Oct. 26.—[Special]—A telegram from Vigo to the Correspondencia says the officers of the Russian squadron give the following explanation of the No. 10 Sea incident:  
While steaming by night they saw two torpedo boats within the lines of the squadron.  
Supposing a Japanese attack was impending they opened fire.  
**NOT LOOKED AT FISHERMEN.**  
They say they did not see any sailors look like fishermen aboard the two boats.  
**KNEW OF SE HURT.**  
The officers say they did not know of any members of the crew being wounded, and they express regret at the error.  
**WATCHING GIBRALTAR STRAIT.**  
GIBRALTAR, Oct. 26.—[Special]—The battleship Hannibal and cruiser Doris are watching the straits closely.  
**GREAT NAVAL ACTIVITY.**  
There is great activity at the Dockyard when the men are working day and night.  
The admiralty is making inquiries concerning the coal available here.

## STEAMER LOADED FOR THE RUSSIANS

LONDON, October 25.—The steamship Esperanza, which is due to sail from Barry with provisions for the Russian Baltic fleet, was found to-day to be in a sinking condition, but the ship was pierced below the water-line. The injury is not explained, but it must have been done to-day, and it is suggested locally that it is wanton act of some man employed about the ship in resentment of the North Sea incident.

## CAPTAIN'S BODY FOUND.

PROVINCETOWNS, Mass., Oct. 24.—The body of Captain Williams, who, with three members of the crew of the schooner Elwood Burton, lost his life October 15, was washed ashore at Race Point today. A letter from the captain's wife and marks on the body were the means of identifying it.
