Dispatches From Rome Indicate This to Be The Policy of Italy

CHIASO, Switzerland, Sept. 28.—The latest despatches from Rome indicate that Italy is trying to put Turkey on the aggressive in an endeavor to provoke an incident which would amount to a casus belli, justifying a declaration of war on the sudden occupation of Tripoli.

LOOKS LIKE PLOT TO DESTROY NAVY

TOULON, September 27.—Despite the opinion of the naval officers, it is confirmed that fires broke out on the Patrie and Suffren on the same morning that the Liberte was destroyed. This adds to the general mystification. Lieutenant Garnier, who was temporarily in command of the Liberte at the time of the explosion, was asked by one of the junior officers some time before the final explosion if the magazines ought not to be flooded. He replied "wait," apparently having in mind the fact that the commander of the battleship Brennus had flooded his magazines when fire was discovered near them four months ago and later was censured by a board of inquiry for premature flooding, resulting in the destruction of ammunition worth \$40,000. When Lieutenant Garnier gave the order to flood the magazines it was too late.

SHIFTED RAILROAD TRACK

TORONTO, Sept. 25.—One hundred Grand Trunk laborers working all Saturday night and Sunday morning altered the route of the railway between Toronto, and Hamilton by moving the tracks at Sunnyside from the upper level to the depressed level through the one mile cut. Sunday morning all trains running east and west between Toronto and Hamilton commenced running over the new depressed tracks and the old high grade is now abolished as far as traffic is concerned.

NEGRO SOUGHT FOR MURDER

WINDSOR, Ont., September 27.—Samuel Dalgion, a Southern negro, is being sought by the police for the murder of Thomas Mills, whose dead body was found near the Michigan Central railway track early last Wednesday morning. The skull was crushed in. The warrant was sworn out upon information furnished by Provincial Detective Reburn, or Toronto, who has been at work on the case for the past few days. Dalgion is one of the dockmen who worked with Mills.
