DUBLIN CASTLE SURRENDERED

DUBLIN, Jan. 17.—Following the statement by the publicity department at Mission House today, the members of the Provincial Government of Ireland received the surrender of Dublin Castle at 1.15 p. m. today. It is now in the hands of the Irish nation for the next few days functions of existing departments of that institution will be continued without in any way prejudicing future actions.
