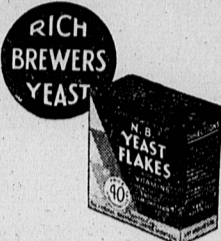

Some day you will want his father's opinion to have weight with little Johnny, but how can it when he has heard you deride father's judgment a thousand times?

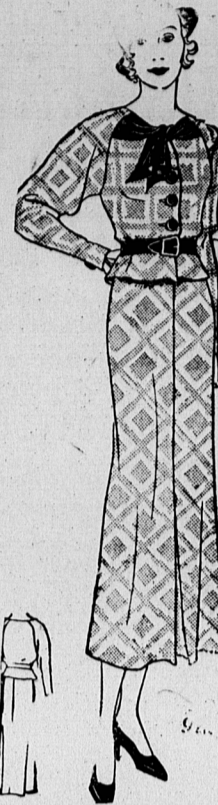

Legislative Assembly Prince Edward Island Rules Relating to Private Bills

- 58. All petitions for Private Bills must be presented within fourteen days after the commencement of the session exclusive of adjournment. 59. No Private Bill shall be brought into the House, but upon a petition first presented, truly stating the case at the peril of the suitors for such Bill and such petition must be signed by the said parties.
