



Colman's Recipes for Dickletime!

You can never make too many pickles and relishes. They touch the finishing touch to your meals—make housewife should be without home-made pickles, chow, catsups, sauces and chutneys.

- MUSTARD PICKLE**
1 pint small cucumbers; 1 pint onions; 1 cup string beans cut diagonally in 1 inch pieces; 1 pint cauliflower cut in small pieces; 2 green peppers chopped; 3 green reds or sliced carrots; 1 pint small green tomatoes cut in halves or quarters.
Soak all vegetables in brine (1 cup of salt to 1 gallon water) overnight. Drain them and soak them in clear water for three hours. Mix a sufficient amount of vinegar and water in equal quantities to cover the vegetables. Allow them to stand in this vinegar for one hour and then scald them in this liquid. Make a dressing of the following ingredients:
1/2 cup white sugar; 4 tablespoons flour; 4 tablespoons Colman's Mustard; 1 teaspoon turmeric; 1 teaspoon celery salt; 3 pints vinegar.
Mix all the dry ingredients and add the hot vinegar slowly stirring it to make a smooth paste. Cook the mixture over a pan of hot water until the sauce thickens.
Drain the vegetables thoroughly. Pour the mustard dressing over them while they are hot and simmer them for 5 minutes. Pack the pickles into hot, clean jars and seal.
- TOMATO MUSTARD**
1 bushel tomatoes; 1/2 ounce mace; 3 ounces white pepper; 3 ounces ground ginger; 3 ounces whole cloves; 2 pounds brown sugar; 1/2 ounce cayenne pepper or less; 1 pound Colman's Mustard; 1 pound salt; 1 dozen large onions, finely sliced; 2 quarts vinegar.
Cut tomatoes and boil one hour. Let cool and press through colander. Add all ingredients except mustard and sugar. Boil slowly for three hours. When nearly cold add mustard and sugar thoroughly mixed in vinegar. The spices in a bag. This will keep for any length of time.

SUNDAY NIGHT SALAD.

When a few friends drop in unexpectedly on Sunday night, a quickly prepared salad is made with canned lobster or chicken as a base. The thoughtful housewife is not likely to be caught without a can of one of these in the house, ready for emergencies. To the fish or fowl—for the sake of extending it as well as for flavor—add half its bulk of celery cut in small pieces, then bleachery cut in cold water to which a little lemon juice has been added. Hard-boiled eggs, chopped pickles or olives may also be added.

TO WASH SILK GLOVES OR HOSE.

Use only luke warm water and pure soap, never an ordinary yellow laundry soap. Do not wring nor twist. Rinse thoroughly, because if any soap is left in pieces, it will discolor them. Wrap them in a towel and squeeze them. Pull gloves lengthwise and stretch stockings into shape and lay flat to dry between a folded towel.

TO SHRINK MATERIALS

Many mothers, and some school girls themselves, are making the new gingham dresses for the opening of school in September. Gingham should be shrunken before being made up, or they will shrink upon the first washing, and that would be a calamity. To shrink materials, fold and place in a tub of warm water. Squeeze the water out gently; do not wring it; or put the goods in with the fold over the line that it may keep its shape. Press the goods on the wrong side. If the material is thin, it may be rolled wet between several thicknesses of Turkish towelling, wrung as dry as possible, and pressed immediately.

First Excursion Leaves On Saturday

MONTREAL, Que., Aug. 16.—Advance inquiries being received at offices of the Canadian National Railways throughout eastern Canada indicate that there will be no difficulty in supplying the quota of 25,000 harvesters for which the western provinces have asked this year. The first of the series of harvest excursions is leaving the Maritime Provinces on Saturday of this week, to be followed by others from Quebec points and from eastern and western Ontario. Harvesters excursion tickets are being placed on sale at stations in the Maritime Provinces on Saturday of this week, in the province of Quebec on Tuesday, Aug. 23rd, Toronto and eastern Ontario on Tuesday, Aug. 30th, and Toronto and west thereof on Wednesday, September 7th.

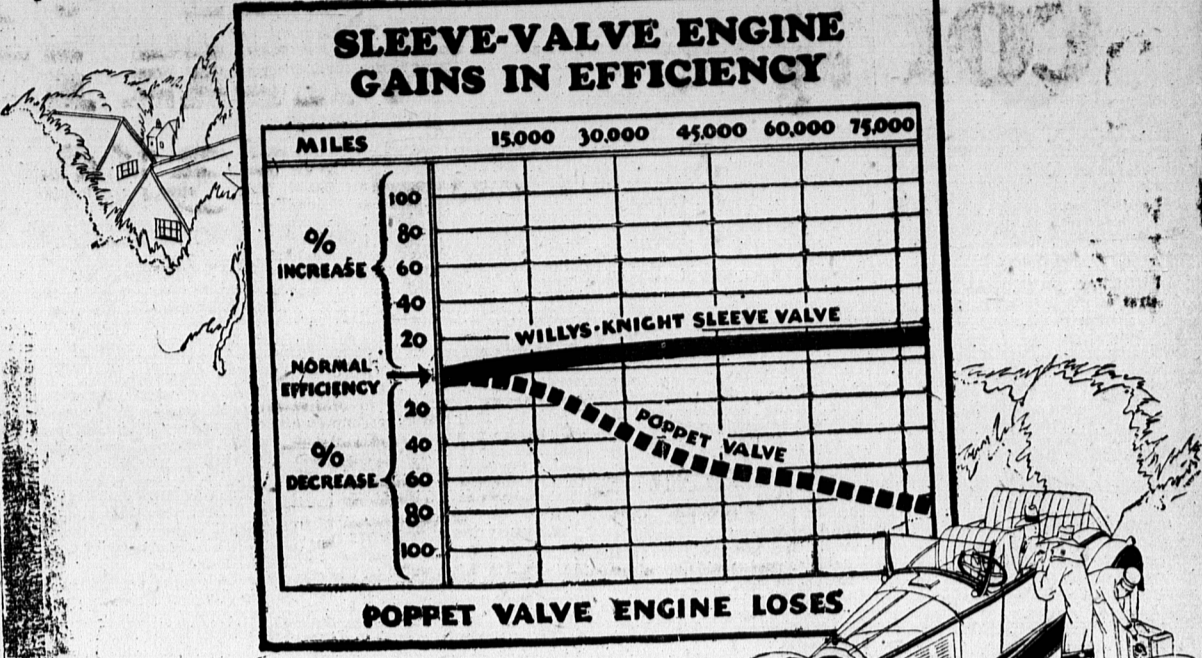
