A WOODSMAN PREDICTS EARLY SEVERE WINTER

All the Signs By Which the Prophets Foretell Point to a Cold Winter Which Will Set In Very Early.

MONTREAL, Oct. 21.—"Every sign familiar to the woodsman points to an early and severe winter."

Mr. L. O. Armstrong, the Colonization Agent of the Canadian Pacific Railway, has lived a great deal in the open spaces of the earth, especially such open spaces as are found in Northern Quebec and Ontario, and he knows the lore of trees and creeks and all the craft of the men who don't depend on weather prophets for their forecasts. He has just returned from a trip to Lake Nipigon, and he says that everything there indicates an early and very severe winter.

In answer to the questions of a reporter today, Mr. Armstrong proceeded to unpack some of his woodcraft and explained his reasons for making such a prediction about the coming winter.

"In the first place," he said, "the creeks are full, which is generally a pretty good sign of early winter, as it is very seldom that the winter sets in before all the watercourses are full. We have now a fine supply of water in the country and this signal is, therefore, set for the approach of winter."

The pelts of fur-bearing animals also furnish indications by which woodsmen judge of the coming winter, and as these animals have already developed very thick coverings of fur, this is also taken to mean that winter will be early and severe. The squirrels, too, who are credited with unusual foresight in the matter of weather forecasts, are said to have laid up large hoards of nuts.

"The Indians in the country about Lake Nipigon," said Mr. Armstrong, "all declare that the coming winter will be early, a long, and a severe one, and these trappers are the very best of weather prophets. Therefore, it is a good idea to lay in winter supplies and get ready for the siege."

Mr. Armstrong admitted, however, that he had seen one sign while on Lake Nipigon, which pointed the other way. He noticed a flock of geese headed north

a rather unusual thing at this time of the year, and one which might be considered a sign of a considerable interval before the coming of winter. The bulk of the signs, however, point to the near approach of frost and snow.

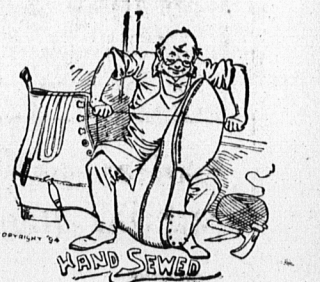
